SECTION A: INFORMATION TO BIDDERS**A.01 OPENING LOCATION**

These bids will be publicly opened at Manatee County Purchasing, 1112 Manatee Avenue West, 8th Floor, Suite 803, Bradenton, Florida 34205, in the presence of County officials at the time and date stated on the cover sheet. All Bidders or their representatives are invited to attend.

A.02 BID INFORMATION AND PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS

Bid documents and the Notices of Source Selection related to those Bids are available for download in a portable document format (.PDF) file on the Manatee County web page on the Purchasing tab under "Bids and Proposals." Manatee County collaborates with the Manatee Chamber of Commerce on distributing solicitations using the RFP Tool on the Chambers' website, <http://www.manateechamber.com> to post Bid documents in a portable document format (.PDF) file. This step is in addition to the posting on Manatee County Government web site.

Note: The County posts Notice of Source Selection(s) for seven calendar days prior to the effective date of the award for purchases in Category Four and above (greater than \$250,000.00).

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH VENDOR, PRIOR TO SUBMITTING THEIR BID, TO CONTACT THE MANATEE COUNTY PURCHASING OFFICE (see contact information on page 1 of this document) TO DETERMINE IF ADDENDA WERE ISSUED AND TO MAKE SUCH ADDENDA A PART OF THEIR BID.

A public internet connection is available during regular business hours in the lobby of the Purchasing Division. If you have questions which cannot be answered by these sources, please contact the individual named on the front page of the Bid.

A.03 BID FORM DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS

Any bids received after the stated time and date will not be considered. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Bidder to have their bid delivered to the Manatee County Purchasing office for receipt on or before the stated time and date. If a bid is sent by U.S. Mail, the Bidder shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Purchasing Office. Bids delayed by mail shall not be considered, shall not be opened at the public opening, and arrangements shall be made for their return at the Bidder's request and expense.

A.04 DEADLINE FOR CLARIFICATION REQUESTS

June 30, 2009 at 3:00 P.M. shall be the deadline to submit all inquiries, suggestions, or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the Invitation for Bid to the Manatee County Purchasing Office.

This deadline has been established to maintain fair treatment for all potential bidders, while maintaining the expedited nature of the Economic Stimulus that the contracting of this work may achieve.

A.05 CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA

Each Bidder shall examine all Invitation for Bids documents and shall judge all matters relating to the adequacy and accuracy of such documents. Any inquiries, suggestions or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the Invitation for Bid shall be made through the Manatee County Purchasing Office. The County shall not be responsible for oral interpretations given by any County employee, representative, or others. The issuance of a written addendum is the only official method whereby interpretation, clarification or additional information can be given.

If any addenda are issued to this Invitation for Bid, the County will BROADCAST THE ADDENDA ON THE MANATEE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE WEB SITE AND ONVIA DEMANDSTAR, IF USED, TO "PLANHOLDERS" IDENTIFIED ON THIS WEB SERVICE; however, it shall be the responsibility of each Bidder, prior to submitting their bid, to contact the Manatee County Purchasing Office (see contact information on page 1) to determine if addenda were issued and to make such addenda a part of their bid.

A.06 SEALED & MARKED

One original and two copies of your bid shall be submitted in one sealed package, clearly marked on the outside "**IFB #09-1403JS Repair and Refurbish Pumps and Pump Motors**" and addressed to:

A.07 LEGAL NAME

Bids shall clearly indicate the legal name, address and telephone number of the Bidder (company, firm, partnership, individual). Bids shall be signed above the typed or printed name and title of the signer. The signer shall have the authority to bind the Bidder to the submitted bid.

A.08 BID EXPENSES

All expenses for making bids to the County are to be borne by the Bidder.

A.09 IRREVOCABLE OFFER

Any bid may be withdrawn up until the date and time set for opening of the bid. Any bid not so withdrawn shall, upon opening, constitute an irrevocable offer for a period of 90 days to sell to Manatee County the goods or services set forth in the attached specifications until one or more of the bids have been duly accepted by the County.

A.10 DISCLOSURE

Upon receipt, all inquires and responses to inquires related to this Invitation for Bid become "Public Records" and are subject to public disclosure consistent with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

Bids become "Public Records" ten (10) days after the bid opening or if an award decision is made earlier than this time as provided by Florida Statute 119.071. No announcement or review of the bid documents shall be conducted at the public opening of the bids.

Based on the above, Manatee County will receive bids at the date and time stated, and will make public at the opening the names of the business entities of all that submitted an offer and any amount presented as a total offer without any verification of the mathematics or the completeness of the offer. Upon the expiration of the statutory term for exemption the actual documents may be inspected or copied. When County staff have completed a mathematic validation and inspected the completeness of the offers, the tabulation shall be posted on www.mymanatee.org.

A.11 RESERVED RIGHTS

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all bids, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Also, the County reserves the right to accept all or any part of the bid and to increase or decrease quantities to meet additional or reduced requirements of the County. Any sole response received by the first submission date may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and current needs of the County. For all items combined, the bid of the lowest responsive, responsible bidder will be accepted, unless all bids are rejected. The lowest responsible bidder shall mean that bidder who makes the lowest bid to sell goods and/or services of a quality which conforms closest to or most exceeds the quality of goods and/or services set forth in the attached specifications or otherwise required by the County, and who is fit and capable to perform the bid as made.

A.11 RESERVED RIGHTS (cont'd)

To be responsive, a bidder shall submit a bid which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the Invitation for Bid. To be a responsible bidder, the bidder shall have the capability in all respects to perform fully the contract requirements, and the tenacity, perseverance, experience, integrity, reliability, capacity, facilities, equipment, and credit which will assure good faith performance. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any bidder to furnish the service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the bidder. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to: current financial statements, verification of availability of equipment and personnel, and past performance records.

A.12 APPLICABLE LAWS

Bidder must be authorized to transact business in the State of Florida. All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Florida and ordinances and regulations of Manatee County will apply to any resulting agreement. Any involvement with any Manatee County procurement shall be in accordance with Manatee County Purchasing Code Ordinance 08-43, as amended. Any actual or prospective bidder who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract may protest to the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County as required in Section 2-26/61 of the Purchasing Code.

A protest with respect to this Invitation for Bid shall be submitted in writing prior to the scheduled opening date of this bid, unless the aggrieved person did not know and could not have been reasonably expected to have knowledge of the facts giving rise to such protest prior to the scheduled opening date of this bid. The protest shall be submitted within seven calendar days after such aggrieved person knows or could have reasonably been expected to know of the facts giving rise thereto.

A.13 CODE OF ETHICS

With respect to this bid, if any Bidder violates or is a party to a violation of the Code of Ethics of Manatee County per Manatee County Purchasing Code Ordinance 08-43, Article 3, Ethics in Public Contracting, and/or the State of Florida per Florida Statutes, Chapter 112, Part III, Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, such Bidder may be disqualified from performing the work described in this bid or from furnishing the goods or services for which the bid is submitted and shall be further disqualified from submitting any future bids for work or for goods or services for Manatee County.

The County anticipates that all statements made and materials submitted in a bid will be truthful. If a Bidder is determined to be untruthful in its bid or any related presentation, such Bidder may be disqualified from further consideration regarding this Invitation for Bid.

A.14 COLLUSION

By offering a submission to this Invitation for Bid the Bidder certifies the Bidder has not divulged to, discussed or compared his bid with other Bidders and has not colluded with any other Bidder or parties to this bid whatsoever. Also, Bidder certifies, and in the case of a joint bid, each party thereto certifies, as to their own organization that in connection with this bid:

- a. any prices and/or data submitted have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices and/or cost data, with any other Bidder or with any competitor;
- b. any prices and/or cost data quoted for this bid have not been knowingly disclosed by the Bidder prior to the scheduled opening directly or indirectly to any competitor;
- c. no attempt has been made or will be made by the Bidder to induce any other person or firm to submit or not to submit a bid for the purpose of restricting competition;
- d. the only person or persons interested in this bid as principal or principals is/are named therein and that no person other than therein mentioned has any interest in this bid or in the contract to be entered into; and
- e. no person or agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees.

A.15 BID FORMS

Bids must be submitted on attached County forms, although additional pages may be attached. **Bidders must fully comply with all bid specifications, terms and conditions.** Failure to comply shall result in contract default, whereupon, the defaulting vendor shall be required to pay for any and all re-procurement costs, damages, and attorney fees as incurred by the County.

A.16 DISCOUNTS

Any and all discounts must be incorporated in the prices contained in the bid and not shown separately. The prices as shown on the bid form shall be the price used in determining award(s).

A.17 TAXES

Manatee County is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Taxes. (F.E.T. Exempt Cert. No. 59-78-0089K; FL Sales Tax Exempt Cert. No. **51-02-027548-53C**); therefore, the vendor is prohibited from delineating a separate line item in his bid for any sales or service taxes. Nothing herein shall affect the vendor's normal tax liability.

A.18 MATHEMATICAL ERRORS

In the event of multiplication/extension error(s), the unit price shall prevail. In the event of addition error(s), the extension totals will prevail. All bids shall be reviewed mathematically and corrected, if necessary, using these standards, prior to additional evaluation.

A.19 DESCRIPTIVE INFORMATION

Unless otherwise specifically provided in the specifications, all equipment, materials and articles incorporated in the work covered by this contract shall be new and of the most suitable grade for the purpose intended. Unless otherwise specifically provided in the specifications, reference to any equipment, material, article or patented process, by trade name, brand name, make or catalog number, shall be regarded as establishing a standard of quality and shall not be construed as limiting competition.

A.20 MODIFICATION OF BID OR PROPOSAL SPECIFICATIONS

If a bidder wishes to recommend changes to the bid specifications, the bidder shall furnish in writing, data and information necessary to aid the County in evaluating the request to modify the specifications. The County is not obligated to make any changes to the bid specifications. Unless an addendum is issued as outlined in paragraph A.05, six calendar days prior to the bid, the bid specifications shall remain unaltered. **Bidders must fully comply with the bid specifications, terms, and conditions.**

A.21 LOBBYING

After the issuance of any Invitation for Bid, prospective Bidders or any agent, representative or person acting at the request of such Bidder shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating in any way to the Invitation for Bid with any officer, agent or employee of Manatee County other than the Purchasing Director or as directed in the Invitation for Bid. This prohibition begins with the issuance of any Invitation for Bid and ends upon execution of the final contract or when the request has been canceled. Violators of this prohibition shall be subject to sanctions as provided in the Manatee County Purchasing Code.

The County reserves the right to amend or to add to the names listed as persons to contact. All amendments or additions to the names listed as persons to contact shall be issued by the Purchasing Division, in writing.

A.22 PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

In accordance with Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, a person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases or real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017 for Category Two (as of

1/01/2005 is \$25,000.00) for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

A.23 DRUG FREE WORK PLACE

Drug Free Workplace Program: Manatee County Board of County Commissioners adopted a policy regarding maintaining a Drug Free Workplace, Resolution R-93-22. Bidders are asked to review the attached copy of the Resolution and provide either a certification of compliance with the program outlined in this Resolution or describe your firm's policy or program as it relates to maintaining a drug free workplace. This response will be considered with the other criteria described herein.

A.24 PUBLIC CONTRACTING AND ENVIRONMENTAL CRIMES CERTIFICATION

In accordance with Ordinance 08-43, adding Article 5, Manatee County Board of County Commissioners adopted a policy prohibiting the award of County contracts to persons, business entities, or affiliates of business entities who have not submitted written certification to the County that they have not been convicted of bribery, attempted bribery, collusion, restraints of trade, price fixing, and violations of certain environmental laws. A Non-Conviction Certification Form is attached for this purpose.

A.25 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Manatee County Board of County Commissioners does not discriminate upon the basis of any individual's disability status. This non-discrimination policy involves every aspect of the County's functions including one's access to, participation, employment, or treatment in its programs or activities. Anyone requiring reasonable accommodation for the **public meetings** specified herein (i.e. Information Conference or Bid Opening), should contact the person named on the first page of this document at least twenty four (24) hours in advance of the activity.

A.26 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Manatee County, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Regulations of the Department of Commerce (15 CFR, Part 8) issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all prospective Bidders that they will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to participate in response to this advertisement and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex, age or national origin in consideration for an award.

A.27 MBE/WBE

The State of Florida, **Office of Supplier Diversity** provides the certification process and the database for identifying certified MBE/WBE firms. NOTE: ANY OR ALL STATEMENTS CONTAINED IN THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS: BASIS OF AWARD, TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT, OR SPECIFICATIONS WHICH VARY FROM THE INFORMATION TO BIDDERS SHALL HAVE PRECEDENCE.

SECTION B: GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS**B.01 CONTRACT FORMS**

The agreement resulting from the acceptance of a bid shall be in the form of a purchase order and shall be bound by the terms and conditions herein.

B.02 ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT

Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of this contract or of his right, title, or interest therein, or his power to execute such contract, or to assign any monies due or to become due thereunder to any other person, firm or corporation unless first obtaining the written consent of the County. The giving of such consent to a particular subcontractor assignment shall not dispense with the necessity of such consent to any further or other assignment.

B.03 QUALITY GUARANTEE

If any product/service delivered does not meet performance representations or other quality assurance representations as published by manufacturers, producers or distributors of such products or the specifications listed in this bid, County reserves the right to reject any or all materials if, in its judgment, the item reflects unsatisfactory workmanship or manufacturing or shipping damage. Also, the vendor shall refund to Manatee County any money which has been paid for same. The vendor will be responsible for attorney fees in the event the supplier defaults and court action is required.

B.04 ROYALTIES AND PATENTS

The vendor shall pay all royalties and license fees for equipment or processes in conjunction with the equipment and/or services he is furnishing. Vendor shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent, trademark or copyright, and shall save the County harmless from loss on account thereof, including costs and attorney's fees.

B.05 INDEMNIFICATION

The successful vendor covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the County, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, suits, actions, damages, causes of action, or judgments arising out of the terms of the resulting agreement for any personal injury, loss of life, or damage to the property sustained as a result of the performance or non-performance of services or delivery of goods; from and against any orders, judgments, or decrees, which may be entered against the County, its agents or employees; and from and against all costs, attorney's fees, expenses and other liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim, suit or action, and the investigation thereof. Nothing in the award, resulting agreement, contract or Purchase Order shall be deemed to affect the rights, privileges and immunities of the County as set forth in Florida Statute Section 768.28.

B.06 REGULATIONS

It shall be the responsibility of the bidder to assure compliance with any OSHA, EPA and/or other Federal or State of Florida rules, regulations or other requirements, as each may apply.

SECTION C: SPECIFIC TERMS AND CONDITIONS

C.01 PURPOSE

It is the intent of The Manatee County Utilities Department to secure an annual contract for the repair and refurbish of pumps and pump motors on an 'as required' basis and to secure the cost and availability of the services for procurement, which serves these primary purposes:

- to have electric pump motors on sewage and effluent pumps repaired/refurbished and/or rewound;
- and where the pump and motor are one unit, to have the pump repaired/refurbished as required.

Work will be done at various locations throughout Manatee County, primarily the Bayshore Lift Stations & Collections, 2003 69th Ave. W., Bradenton, FL; the Southwest Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant, 5101 65th St. W., Bradenton, FL; and the Water Treatment Plant, 17915 Waterline Road, Bradenton, FL.

C.02 BLANKET ORDER

Blanket Purchase Order(s) shall be issued as a result of this bid. A Blanket Purchase Order number, when accompanied by a valid Release order number provided by an authorized County department, will authorize purchases on an 'as required' basis. (Note: The quantities shown on the Bid Form are estimates only. There is no guarantee that these quantities will be released.)

For payment, each invoice must indicate the six digit Blanket Purchase Order number followed by a valid five digit Release Order number.

C.03 QUANTITIES

The quantities listed on the Bid Form represent the County's best estimate of the current number of pumps to be serviced per year and may be used by the Bidder as a guide; however, no warranty or guarantee of quantities to be serviced is given or implied. It is understood that the contractor will furnish the County's needs as they arise. Release Orders shall be issued on an 'as required' basis, covering all or part of the specified items on the Bid Form.

C.04 DELIVERY SCHEDULE

Vendor shall pick up equipment requiring repair within 48 hours after being notified by an authorized County representative. Repairs shall be completed within five (5) working days after pickup by the vendor for electric motors only and within ten (10) working days after pickup where pump and motor is one unit (sewage, effluent and lift station pumps) and both require repair/refurbishment.

Note: Any emergency repairs required shall be completed by the successful vendor within forty-eight (48) hours and returned to the pickup location.

C.05 PRICES & TERM

Bidders shall bid a unit price (per pump), including all discounts, that will include all cost associated with repair and refurbishing. The prices bid shall be firm for a period of one year and shall include payment in full for all transportation, labor, and equipment used in providing the required services.

C.06 RENEWAL

This contract is for one (1) year and shall be renewable for two (2) additional years as determined by Manatee County and based on the availability of funds for each year. If not cancelled by the contractor or the County, **this contract shall be automatically extended/renewed** beyond the first 12 month contract period for two additional 12 month period not to exceed a total contract duration of 36 months providing there are no changes of prices, terms or conditions. **Written notice of intention not to renew must be submitted by the successful bidder 90 days prior to the end of a contract period.**

C.07 PAYMENT

The contractor shall be paid according to bid costs for services rendered. Payment shall be made upon completion of service after an invoiced description of all repairs has been reviewed. The contractor will submit each invoice in sufficient detail to document the completed work. Invoices shall contain the following information: blanket purchase order number, release order number, copy of service reports including description of work and location, and total cost.

C.08 CANCELLATION

Any failure of the contractor to furnish or perform the Work (including, but not limited to, commencement of the Work, failure to supply sufficient skilled workers or suitable materials or equipment) in accordance with the contract, the County may order the stop of the Work, or any portion thereof, until the cause for such order has been eliminated. If the contractor persistently fails to perform the Work in accordance with the contract, the County reserves the right to terminate the contract and select the next qualified bidder or re-advertise this procurement in part or in whole. The County reserves the right to cancel all or any undelivered or unexecuted portion of this contract with or without cause.

C.09 WARRANTY AND GUARANTEE PROVISIONS

All work, materials, and equipment furnished as defined herein shall be guaranteed and warranted by the contractor for a minimum period of one year, unless otherwise specified, from final acceptance by the Owner to be free from defects due either to faulty materials or equipment or faulty workmanship.

C.10 INSURANCE

The contractor will not commence work under a contract until all insurance under this section and such insurance coverage as might be required by the County has been obtained. The contractor shall obtain, and submit to Purchasing within 15 calendar days of request, at his expense, the following minimum amounts of insurance (inclusive of any amounts provided by an umbrella or excess policy):

a. Workers' Compensation/Employers' Liability

Part One - There shall be no maximum limit (other than as limited by the applicable statute) for liability imposed by Florida Worker's Compensation Act or any other coverage required by the contract documents which are customarily insured under Part One of the standard Worker's Compensation Policy.

Part Two - The minimum amount of coverage required by the contract documents which are customarily insured under Part Two of the standard Workers' Compensation Policy shall be:

<u>\$100,000</u>	(Each Accident)
<u>\$500,000</u>	(Disease-Policy Limit)
<u>\$100,000</u>	(Disease-Each Employee)

b. Commercial General Liability

The limits are to be applicable only to work performed under this contract and shall be those that would be provided with the attachment of the Amendment of Limits of Insurance (Designated Project or Premises) endorsement (ISO Form CG 25 03) to a Commercial General Liability Policy with the following minimum limits.

The minimum OPC Policy limits per occurrence and, if subject to an aggregate, annual aggregate to be provided by the contractor shall be the same as the amounts shown above as the minimum per occurrence and general policy aggregate limits respectively required for the Commercial General Liability coverage. The limits afforded by the OPC Policy and any excess policies shall apply only to the Owner and the Owner's officials, officers, agents and employees and only to claims arising out of or in connection with the work under this contract.

C.10 INSURANCE (cont'd)e. Certificates of Insurance and Copies of Policies

Certificates of Insurance in triplicate evidencing the insurance coverage specified in the six above paragraphs a., b., c., and d., shall be filed with the Purchasing Director before operations are begun. The required certificates of insurance shall name the types of policy, policy number, date of expiration, amount of coverage, companies affording coverage, and also shall refer specifically to the bid number, project title and location of project. Insurance shall remain in force at least one year after completion and acceptance of the project by the County, in the amounts and types as stated herein, with coverage for all products and services completed under this contract.

ADDITIONAL INSURED: - The contractor shall name Manatee County as additional insured in each of the applicable policies.

If the initial insurance expires prior to the completion of operations and/or services by the contractor, renewal certificates of insurance and required copies of policies shall be furnished by the contractor and delivered to the Purchasing Director 30 days prior to the date of their expiration.

SECTION D: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS**D.01 SCOPE OF WORK**

The successful vendor shall provide all transportation, labor; materials, tests and equipment pick up of pumps and/or pump motors and perform any recondition/rewind necessary to return them to the point of delivery fully operational.

- a. All work shall be in accordance with the Electrical Apparatus Service Association's (EASA) Recommended Practice, January, 1998 Revision, Section 1 (Electrical Apparatus), Section 2 (Mechanical Repair – Rotating Apparatus), Section 3 (Rewinding – Rotating Apparatus) and Section 4 (Testing) and the National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA) standards for service and repair of electrical apparatus.
- b. Work shall also be in compliance with standards set by the following developmental organizations:
 1. Underwriters Laboratories (UL)
 - a. Underwriters Laboratories – Certified motors shall be recertified after repair.
 - b. Successful vendor's shop or his sub-contractor's shop shall be UL-certified to rebuild explosion-proof electric motors for use in hazardous environments.
 2. American National Standards Institute (ANSI)
 3. American Society for Testing & Materials (ASTM)
 4. National Electrical Code (NEC)
 5. National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA)
 6. National Electrical Motor Association (NEMA)
- c. Pickup and delivery of installed motors shall be accomplished at no charge.

D.02 RECONDITION/REPAIR OF ELECTRIC MOTORS DEFINED

(Test, Disassemble and Inspect, Clean, Dip and Bake Windings, Replace Bearings, Assemble, Test and Paint)

a. Pre-Disassembly Test

1. Using a 1000V meg-ohm meter, conduct verification of insulation integrity. Acceptable criteria is 1.5 meg-ohms or higher.
2. Verify that heaters are operational and that other attached features, such as thermocouples, have continuity.
3. Single-phase test to check for open rotors. (After disassembly, rotors will be inspected for evidence of damaged, cracked or open circuit bars or end rings. If there is evidence of faults, the rotor will be growl-tested.) The detection of any defect during testing shall be reported promptly to the Authorized County representative.
4. Pre-disassembly documentation shall include the condition of mechanical fits (i.e. shaft run out), cracked, broken or missing parts, test run at full voltage, current readings, meg reading and surge comparison test as received. The Authorized County representative listed on the work order shall be notified if acceptable criteria are not met.

b. Motor Disassembly

1. Completely disassemble motor and steam clean all mechanical parts using a mild detergent compatible with winding insulation; thoroughly rinse; bake dry.
2. Disassembly documentation shall include the cause of failure and/or conditions contributing to failure.

c. Motor Inspection

1. Visually inspect coils and windings for excessive wear, signs of conductor overheating or fatigue that possibly would not be apparent during an electrical test.
2. All stators shall be surge-tested with an electronic surge tester specifically designed to apply a surge voltage street test simultaneously between turns of a coil, between phases, from winding to ground and to detect short-circuited turns in winding under test.

D.02 RECONDITION/REPAIR OF ELECTRIC MOTORS DEFINED (CONT'D.)

d. Mechanical Fit

1. Measure the bearing bores, shells, housings and shaft journals using a micrometer. Outside diameter of bore of housing shall have 0.000" to -0.001" loose fit. Repairs are necessary when tolerance exceeds 0.0015". Machine work shall be approved by the Authorized County representative before being performed or machine work may not be paid for. Bearings journals, seal surfaces and bearing housing restoration shall be done by metalizing and machining or boring and busing. Documentation of before and after measurements shall be made.
2. Replace bearings per manufacturer's specifications. All grease fittings, plugs, etc. shall be replaced unless otherwise indicated by the Authorized County representative. Bearings shall be properly lubricated and bearing oil reservoirs shall be filled where practical. All equipment shall be tagged with information as to whether or not bearing oil reservoirs were filled and what type of lubricant was used.

e. Rotor Balancing

1. All rotors of motors rated at 50 HP/3600/1800 RPM and above shall be dynamically balanced, with the rotor running at rated speed where practical, but no less than 350 RPM in the balance stand.
2. A printout tape from the balance/analyzer shall be furnished detailing the final balance values. This tape will be attached to the recondition/repair/rewind documents when the motor is delivered.

f. Motor Leads

Motor leads shall be permanently tagged with non-magnetic markers. Motor lead configuration shall not be altered.

g. Insulation

1. Windings shall be double-dipped with Class H varnish and baked.
2. Machine-finished surfaces bore of the stator lamination and periphery of the rotor laminations shall be cleaned of all varnish and foreign materials. Documentation of this process shall be made.

D.02 RECONDITION/REPAIR OF ELECTRIC MOTORS DEFINED (CONT'D.)

h. Final Test

1. A 1000 volt meg-ohm meter shall be used to verify insulation continuity. This reading shall be documented. After reassembly, motor shall be test-run at rated voltage and frequency. No load voltage and phase currents shall be recorded. Vibration mils displacement shall be measured and recorded in the horizontal, vertical and axial planes on both ends of the motor, or top and bottom of vertical motors and documentation of current reading and vibration readings shall be provided to the end user.
2. A 5KV meg-ohm meter shall be used to verify insulation continuity of all 4160V motors.

i. Paint

1. Exterior of motor shall be properly cleaned of rust and foreign material, prime painted and finish painted with a good grade of machinery enamel, the same color as received unless otherwise specified. Nameplates, machined surfaces and internal parts shall be protected from paint.
2. When needed, the interiors of motor frames and parts shall be painted with an insulating paint. This includes rotors, bearing brackets, frame interiors and air deflectors. Windings shall not be painted.

D.03 REWIND OF ELECTRIC MOTORS DEFINED

NOTE: When rewind is done in conjunction with a recondition/repair, many of the items below will be redundant and shall not be performed or charged for twice. The items below apply to stator only (including all labor, materials and testing necessary for "ready-for County-use").

a. Pre-Disassembly Test

1. Using a 1000V meg-ohm meter, conduct verification for insulation integrity. Acceptable criteria is 1.5 meg-ohms or higher.
2. A 5KV meg-ohm meter shall be used to verify insulation integrity of all 4160V motors.
3. Verify that heaters are operational and other attached features such as thermocouples have continuity.

D.03 REWIND OF ELECTRIC MOTORS DEFINED (CONT'D.)

4. Pre-disassembly documentation shall include the condition of mechanical fits (i.e. shaft run-out), cracked, broken or missing parts, test run at full voltage, current readings, meg reading and surge comparison test as received.
 5. Authorized County representative listed on the work order shall be notified if acceptable criteria are not met.
- b. Stripping
1. Windings shall be removed by **temperature-controlled burnout** with oven temperature suppression. Burn-out temperature shall not exceed 750 degrees Fahrenheit.
 2. Windings shall be removed in such a fashion as not to damage or distort the core iron. Upon removal of the old windings and insulation, the core shall be thoroughly cleaned and inspected for burrs, etc.
- c. Winding
1. General: Rewound motors shall meet or exceed all O.E.M. operating characteristics, unless otherwise specified by the County. Class F insulation shall be used, unless otherwise specified. Magnet wire shall be a dual-coated, insulated wire of domestic manufacture that is hermetic-approved and meets or exceeds NEMA specification MW-35A. After winding and **prior to resin treatment**, windings will be surge-comparison tested and the results documented.
 2. Resin Treatment: Windings shall be double-dipped with Class H varnish and baked.
- d. Motor Leads: Motor leads that are replaced must be the same length and configuration as the original leads. Leads will be permanently tagged with non-magnetic markers.
- e. Insulation: Windings shall be double-dipped with Class H varnish and baked.
- f. Final Test: A 1000 volt meg-ohm meter shall be used to verify insulation continuity. This reading shall be documented. After reassembly, motor shall be test-run at full voltage and documentation of current reading and vibration readings shall be provided to the end user. (NOTE: a 5 KV meg-ohm meter shall be used on all 4160V motors.)

D.04 PUMP RECONDITION DEFINED

- a. Disassemble and clean.
- b. Replace seals and ball bearings per EASA Standards. Vendor shall use only manufacturer-recommended ball bearings and mechanical seals.
- c. Change oil.
- d. Test windings and rewind as necessary.
- e. Reassemble and test.

D.05 SERVICE CALL DEFINED

Any labor required to uninstall, reinstall, rewire or repair on-site.

Note: Based on past usage, service calls are rarely required.

D.06 MACHINE WORK DEFINED

Machine work, as defined herein, shall apply to the drilling and tapping of broken bolts, the repairing of damaged locking rings and stators, the replacing of power cords, power cord assemblies and power cord connectors and repairs to impellers, covers, volutes, mounting rails, bearing journals, pump shafts and anything else not listed in D.02, above.

D.07 REFURBISH/REPAIR, REWIND AND MACHINE WORK ESTIMATES

- a. Successful vendor shall provide Owner or Owner's authorized representative with a written cost estimate on each pump/motor picked up for repair. Estimate may be delivered by facsimile, or phoned in and a hard copy mailed. Estimate shall be provided within 48 hours of pickup and shall be authorized or rejected by Owner's authorized representative at that time and prior to commencement of work.
- b. Additionally, the Authorized County representative shall be notified of any repairs which may be needed over and above the contract price of the recondition/repair and/or rewind and at that time Contact person will either authorize or reject the additional work.
- c. Should there be a lapse of time between presentation by Vendor of an estimate and approval of estimate by Owner, time elapsed will be added to the amount of time allocated for repair in Paragraph C.04 of the Specific Terms and Conditions.

D.08 EMERGENCY REPAIRS

- a. As stated in Paragraph C.04 of the Specific Terms and Conditions, all emergency work shall be completed by the Vendor **within forty-eight (48) hours** and returned to the pick-up location.

D.08 EMERGENCY REPAIRS (CONT'D.)

- b. Bidder shall include all costs for transportation, labor, materials, testing and equipment in the "Emergency Repair Mark-Up Percentage" indicated on the Bid Form. This percentage times the listed price of the pump/motor recondition/rewind shall be the basis for reimbursement for that work.

D.09 REFURBISH/REPAIR AND/OR REWIND OF PUMPS, MOTORS NOT INCLUDED ON BID FORM

- a. Vendor shall have been registered with the Florida Department of State for at least six (6) continuous years.
- b. Vendor or Vendor's subcontractor shall have been certified as an "Explosion-Proof, UL Facility" for at least six (6) continuous years and shall provide a copy of his certification with his Bid submittal.
- c. Vendor shall be responsible for obtaining O.E.M. technical documents, drawings and parts when necessary.
- d. Vendor shall have all engineering, design, metalizing, welding, heat-treating, machining, balancing, calibrating and testing capabilities necessary to completely refurbish/rewind any pumps/motors listed on the Bid Form.
 1. Above will include but not be limited to: Curing and burnout oven(s), both with controlled temperature gauges; shop cranes; despoiling device(s); winding system.
