Manatee County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, (hereinafter the "County") will receive sealed bids from individuals, corporations, partnerships, and other legal entities authorized to conduct business in the State of Florida.

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This project is funded by a U.S. Department of Energy, Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG), as administered through Manatee County. There are federal regulations applied to the duration of the project's lifecycle. Bidders should be prepared to comply with such requirements, as outlined in Section F, "Compliance with Federal Laws." Federal and State Guidelines for this procurement will apply.

Important Note: A prohibition of Lobbying has been enacted. Please review paragraph A.07, Page 3. to avoid violation and possible sanctions.

A. INFORMATION TO BIDDERS

A.01 **OPENING LOCATION**

Bids will be publicly opened in the Manatee County Purchasing Office, 1112 Manatee Avenue West, Suite 803, Bradenton, FL 34205 in the presence of County officials at the time and date stated. All bidders or their representatives are invited to be present.

Any bids received after the stated time and date will not be considered. It shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder to have their bid delivered to the Manatee County Purchasing Division for receipt on or before the stated time and date. If a bid is sent by U.S. Mail, the bidder shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Purchasing Division. Bids delayed by mail shall not be considered, shall not be opened at the public opening, and arrangements shall be made for their return at the respondent's request and expense.

A.02 **SEALED & MARKED**

One original and two copies of your bid shall be submitted in one <u>sealed</u> package, clearly marked on the outside <u>"Sealed Bid #10-0795TR</u> with your company name.

A.03 **BID DOCUMENTS**

Bid documents and the Notices of Source Selection related to those Bids are available for download in a portable document format (.PDF) file on the Manatee County web page on the Purchasing tab under "Bids."

A.04 MODIFICATION OF BID SPECIFICATIONS

If a bidder wishes to recommend changes to the bid specifications, the bidder shall furnish in writing, data and information necessary to aid the County in evaluating the request to modify the specifications. The County is not obligated to make any changes to the bid specifications. Unless an addendum is issued, the bid specifications shall remain unaltered. Bidders must fully comply with the bid specifications, terms, and conditions.

A.05 **DEADLINE FOR CLARIFICATION REQUESTS**

<u>Tuesday, January 26, 2010, 5:00 PM</u> shall be the deadline to submit all inquiries, suggestions, or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the Invitation for Bids to the Manatee County Purchasing Office.

This deadline has been established to maintain fair treatment of all potential bidders, while maintaining the expedited nature of the Economic Stimulus that the contracting of this work may achieve.

A.06 **CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA**

Each bidder shall examine all Invitation for Bids documents and shall judge all matters relating to the adequacy and accuracy of such documents. Any inquiries, suggestions or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the Invitation for Bids shall be made through the Manatee County Purchasing Office. The County shall not be responsible for oral interpretations given by any County employee, representative, or others. The issuance of a written addendum is the only official method whereby interpretation, clarification or additional information can be given.

If any addenda are issued to this Invitation for Bid, the County will Broadcast the addenda on the Demand Star distribution system to "Planholders" on this web service, and post the documents on the Purchasing Division's web page. It shall be the <u>responsibility of each bidder, prior to submitting</u> their bid, to contact Manatee County Purchasing (see contact on page 1) to <u>determine if addenda were issued</u> and to make such addenda a part of their bid.

The County reserves the right to amend or to add to the names listed as persons to contact. All amendments or additions to the names listed as persons to contact shall be issued by the Purchasing Division, in writing.

A.07 **LOBBYING**

After the issuance of any Invitation For Bid, prospective bidders, or any agent, representative or person acting at the request of such bidder shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating in any way to the Invitation For Bid with any officer, agent or employee of Manatee County other than the Purchasing Director or as directed in the Invitation For Bid. This prohibition begins with the issuance of any Invitation For Bid, and ends upon execution of the final contract or when the invitation has been cancelled. Violators of this prohibition shall be subject to sanctions as provided in the Manatee County Purchasing Code.

A.08 BID EXPENSES

All expenses for making bids to the County are to be borne by the bidder.

A.09 **IRREVOCABLE OFFER**

Any bid may be withdrawn up until the date and time set for opening of the bid. Any bid not so withdrawn shall, upon opening, constitute an irrevocable offer for a period of 90 days to sell to Manatee County the goods or services set forth in the attached specifications until one or more of the bids have been duly accepted by the County.

A.10 **RESERVED RIGHTS**

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all bids, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Also, the County reserves the right to accept all or any part of the bid and to increase or decrease quantities to meet additional or reduced requirements of the County. Any sole response received by the first submission date may or may not be rejected by the County depending on available competition and current needs of the County. For all items combined, the bid of the lowest responsive, responsible bidder will be accepted, unless all bids are rejected.

The <u>lowest</u> responsible bidder shall mean that bidder who makes the lowest bid to sell goods and/or services of a quality which conforms closest to or most exceeds the quality of goods and/or services set forth in the attached specifications or otherwise required by the County, and who is fit and capable to perform the bid as made.

To be <u>responsive</u>, a bidder shall submit a bid which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the Invitation For Bid. To be a <u>responsible</u> bidder, the bidder shall have the capability in all respects to perform fully the contract requirements, and the tenacity, perseverance, experience, integrity, reliability, capacity, facilities, equipment, and credit which will assure good faith performance. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any bidder to furnish the service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the bidder. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to: current financial statements, verification of availability of equipment and personnel, and past performance records.

A.11 APPLICABLE LAWS

Bidder must be authorized to transact business in the State of Florida. All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Florida and ordinances and regulations of Manatee County will apply to any resulting agreement. Any involvement with any Manatee County procurement shall be in accordance with Manatee County Code of Laws, as amended. Any actual or prospective bidder who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of a contract may protest to the Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County as required in Chapter 2-26, Article VI of the Manatee County Code of Laws.

A protest with respect to this Invitation For Bids shall be submitted in writing <u>prior to the scheduled opening date</u> of this bid, unless the aggrieved person did not know and could not have been reasonably expected to have knowledge of the facts giving rise to such protest prior to the scheduled opening date of this bid. The protest shall be submitted <u>within seven calendar days</u> after such aggrieved person knows or could have reasonably been expected to know of the facts giving rise thereto.

A.12 **COLLUSION**

By offering a submission to this Invitation For Bid, the bidder certifies that he has not divulged, discussed or compared their bid with other bidder, and <u>has not colluded</u> with any other bidder or parties to this bid whatsoever. Also, bidder certifies, and in the case of a joint bid each party thereto certifies as to their own organization, that in connection with this bid:

1. any prices and/or cost data submitted have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication, or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as

- to any matter relating to such prices and/or cost data, with any other bidder or with any competitor:
- any prices and/or cost data quoted for this bid have not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder and will not knowingly be disclosed by the bidder, prior to the scheduled opening, directly or indirectly to any other bidder or to any competitor;
- 3. no attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to induce any other person or firm to submit or not to submit a bid for the purpose of restricting competition;
- 4. the only person or persons interested in this bid, principal or principals is/are named therein and that no person other than therein mentioned has any interest in this bid or in the contract to be entered into; and
- no person or agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding or a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee excepting bona fide employees or established commercial agencies maintained by bidder for purpose of doing business.

A.13 CODE OF ETHICS

With respect to this bid, if any bidder violates or is a party to a violation of the <u>Code of Ethics</u> of Manatee County per Manatee County Code of Laws, Article 3, Ethics in Public Contracting, and/or the State of Florida per Florida Statutes, Chapter 112, Part III, Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, such bidder may be disqualified from performing the work described in this bid or from furnishing the goods or services for which the bid is submitted and shall be further disqualified from submitting any future bids for work or for goods or services for Manatee County. The County anticipates that all statements made and materials submitted in a bid will be truthful. If a bidder is determined to be untruthful in its bid or any related presentation, such bidder may be disqualified from further consideration regarding this Invitation For Bids.

A.14 **BID FORMS**

Bids must be submitted on attached County forms, although additional pages may be attached. Bidders must fully comply with all bid specifications, terms and conditions. Failure to comply shall result in contract default, whereupon, the defaulting vendor shall be required to pay for any and all re-procurement costs, damages, and attorney fees as incurred by the County.

A.15 **LEGAL NAME**

Bids shall clearly indicate the legal name, address and telephone number of the bidder, and shall be signed above the typed or printed name and title of the signer. The signer must have the authority to bind the bidder to the submitted bid.

A.16 **DRUG FREE WORK PLACE**

The Manatee County Board of County Commissioners adopted a policy regarding bidders maintaining a Drug Free Work Place, prohibiting the award of bids to any person or entity that has not submitted written certification to the County that it has complied with those requirements [Reference Resolution R-93-22, Manatee County Purchasing Policies, Section 4, E (1) (a)]. A Drug Free Work Place Certification Form is attached to this bid for this purpose, and must be submitted with the bid package.

A.17 DISQUALIFYING CRIMINAL MATTERS; CERTIFICATION REQUIRED

A person or affiliate who has been placed on the State's convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime, as that term is defined in Florida Statute s. 287.133, may not submit a bid, proposal, or reply on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity; may not submit a bid, proposal, or reply on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; may not submit bids, proposals, or replies on leases of real property to a public entity; may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity; and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Florida Statute s. 287.017 for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months following the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list. In addition, the Manatee County Code prohibits the award of any contract to any person or entity who/which has, within the past 5 years, been convicted of, or admitted to in court or sworn to under oath, a public entity crime or of an environmental law that, in the reasonable opinion of the purchasing official, establishes reasonable grounds to believe the person or business entity will not conduct business in a responsible manner; To ensure compliance with the foregoing, the Code requires all persons or entities desiring to contract with the County to execute and file with the purchasing official an affidavit, executed under the pain and penalties of perjury, confirming that person, entity, and any person(s) affiliated with the entity, does not have a such a record and is therefore eligible to seek and be awarded business with the County. In the case of a business entity other than a partnership or a corporation, such affidavit shall be executed by an authorized agent of the entity. In the case of a partnership, such affidavit shall be executed by the general partner(s). A confirming Criminal Matters Certification Affidavit is attached for this purpose (ref. Attachment "C").

A.18 **DISCOUNTS**

Any and all discounts must be incorporated in the prices contained in the bid and not shown separately. The prices as shown on the bid form shall be the price used in determining award.

A.19 **TAXES**

Manatee County is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Taxes. (F.E.T. Exempt Cert. No. 59-78-0089K; FL Sales Tax Exempt Cert. No. **51-02-027548-53C**); therefore, the vendor is prohibited from delineating a separate line item in his bid for any sales or service taxes. Nothing herein shall affect the vendor's normal tax liability.

A.20 **DESCRIPTIVE INFORMATION**

Unless otherwise specifically provided in the specifications, all equipment, materials and articles incorporated in the work covered by this contract shall be new and of the most suitable grade for the purpose intended. Unless otherwise specifically provided in the specifications, reference to any equipment, material, article or patented process, by trade name, brand name, make or catalog number, shall be regarded as establishing a standard of quality and shall not be construed as limiting competition.

A.21 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, does not discriminate upon the basis of any individual's disability status. This non-discrimination policy involves every aspect of the County's functions including one's access to, participation, employment, or treatment in its programs or activities. Anyone requiring reasonable accommodation for an

Information Conference or Bid Opening should contact the person named on the first page of this bid document at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of either activity.

A.22 **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY CLAUSE**

Manatee County, in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Regulations of the Department of Commerce (15 CFR, Part 8) issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all vendors that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this advertisement and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color or national origin in consideration for an award.

A.23 MATHEMATICAL ERRORS

In the event of multiplication/extension error(s), the unit price shall prevail. In the event of addition error(s) the extension totals will prevail. All bids shall be reviewed mathematically and corrected, if necessary, using these standards, prior to additional evaluation.

A.24 **DISCLOSURE**

Upon receipt, all inquires and responses to inquires related to this Invitation for Bid become "Public Records" and are subject to public disclosure consistent with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

Bids become "Public Records" ten (10) days after the bid opening or if an award decision is made earlier than that time as provided by Florida Statue 119.071. No announcement or review of the bid documents shall be conducted at the public opening of the bids.

Based on the above, Manatee County will receive bids at the date and time stated, and will make public at the opening the names of the business entities of all that submitted an offer and any amount presented as a total offer without any verification of the mathematics or the completeness of the offer. Upon the expiration of the statutory term for exemption the actual documents may be inspected or copied. When County staff have completed a mathematic validation and inspected the completeness of the offers, the tabulation shall be posted on www.mymanatee.org.

ANY OR ALL STATEMENTS CONTAINED IN THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS: BASIS OF AWARD, TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE CONTRACT, OR SPECIFICATIONS, WHICH VARY FROM THE INFORMATION TO BIDDERS, SHALL HAVE PRECEDENCE.

B. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

B.01 **CONTRACT FORMS**

Any agreement, contract, or purchase order resulting from the acceptance of a bid shall be made by a purchase order and be bound by the terms and conditions therein.

The transmitted purchase order shall serve as a Notice of Acceptance and Notice to Proceed per the schedule detailed in this Bid. Failure to comply with the conditions as set forth in the purchase order shall be deemed a breach of contract subjecting the Bidder to litigated damages, forfeiture of posted security and/or other possible penalties.

B.02 **AUTHORIZED PRODUCT REPRESENTATION**

The vendor by virtue of submitting the name and specification of a manufacturer's products will be required to furnish the named manufacturer's product. The vendor's failure to perform accordingly may, in the County's sole discretion, be deemed a breach of contract, and shall constitute grounds for the County's immediate termination of the contract.

B.03 **QUALITY GUARANTEE**

If any product/service delivered does not meet performance representations or other quality assurance representations as published by manufacturers, producers or distributors of such products or the specifications listed in this bid, the vendor shall pick up the product from the County at no expense to the County. The County reserves the right to reject any or all materials if, in its judgment, the item reflects unsatisfactory workmanship or manufacturing or shipping damage. Also, the vendor shall refund to Manatee County any money which has been paid for same. The vendor will be responsible for attorney fees in the event the supplier defaults and court action is required.

B.04 **ROYALTIES AND PATENTS**

The vendor shall pay all royalties and license fees for equipment or processes in conjunction with the equipment and/or services he is furnishing. Vendor shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent, trademark or copyright, and shall save the County harmless from loss on account thereof, including costs and attorney's fees.

B.05 **INDEMNIFICATION**

The successful vendor covenants and agrees to <u>indemnify and save harmless</u> the County, its agents and employees, from and against all claims, suits, actions, damages, causes of action, or judgments arising out of the terms of the resulting agreement for any personal injury, loss of life, or damage to the property sustained as a result of the performance or non-performance of services or delivery of goods; from and against any orders, judgments, or decrees, which may be entered against the County, its agents or employees; and from and against all costs, attorney's fees, expenses and other liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim, suit or action, and the investigation thereof. Nothing in the award, resulting agreement, contract or Purchase Order shall be deemed to affect the rights, privileges and immunities of the County as set forth in Florida Statutes Section 768.28.

B.06 **REGULATIONS**

It shall be the responsibility of the bidder to assure compliance with any OSHA, EPA and/or other Federal or State of Florida rules, regulations or other requirements, as each may apply.

B.07 MANUALS, SCHEMATICS, HANDBOOKS

All manuals, schematics and handbooks shall be provided which are applicable to the equipment delivered. An operators manual, parts manual and technician manual must also be provided. Parts lists (manuals) must include OEM part numbers for items not manufactured by the bidder.

B.08 PRICES & TERM

The prices bid shall be used for payment and this price shall be deemed to include payment in full for all equipment, F.O.B. Destination, including all discounts in accordance with the Bid Form.

B.09 **PAYMENT**

Within forty-five (45) days after delivery of equipment, acceptance by the County, and the presentation of an invoice, County shall pay vendor total amount due.

B.10 **CANCELLATION**

The Purchase Order (Contract) shall be subject to immediate cancellation, if either product or service does not comply with the specifications, terms, or conditions stated herein. Products or services which do not comply with the specifications, terms or conditions stated herein will be returned and no payment for such defective items shall be due.

B.11 WARRANTY, MAINTENANCE SERVICE AND SUPPORT

The successful bidder shall furnish <u>factory</u> warranty on all equipment furnished hereunder against defect in material and/or workmanship. The <u>factory</u> warranty for the material provided shall become effective on the date of delivery and acceptance by the County. Should any defect in materials or workmanship, excepting ordinary wear and tear, appear during the above stated warranty period, the successful bidder shall repair or replace same at no cost to the County immediately upon written notice from the Purchasing official. The successful bidder will not be liable under the above warranty for any defects or damages resulting from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the bidder, such as misuse or neglect by the County, acts of God, fires, floods, and hurricanes.

C. SPECIFIC TERMS AND CONDITIONS

C.01 PURPOSE

Manatee County will replace 1,178 existing (County owned) 250 watt and 400 watt High Pressure Sodium (HPS) roadway lighting fixtures with an LED equivalent fixture. The project would affect various segments of county maintained roadways and intersections. The LED lighting installations shall be done by County staff.

The lighting fixtures chosen for the project shall meet minimum existing photometric requirements suitable for the conditions in which they will be applied. The lighting fixtures chose shall meet all applicable electrical industry standards, (see Technical Specifications below).

C.02 INFORMATION CONFERENCE

No Information Conference is scheduled.

C.03 **DELIVERY TIME**

All materials shall be acquired within 120 days after award of this bid. The schedule delivery of material may be proportioned on a monthly basis, depending upon the install rate and space to store the fixtures. Manatee County has limited space available for such storage. The projected timeline is to install approximately 100 fixtures per month with a project completion within 18 months.

C.04 AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009 COMPLIANCE

The following American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) requirements are applicable to this solicitation and any resultant contract:

DUNS NUMBER

Bidders will be required to provide Manatee County their unique Dun and Bradstreet "Data Universal Numbering System" (DUNS) number with their bid submittal. If you do not know or do not have a DUNS number, visit www.dnb.com and click on "Get a D-U-N-S Number" to obtain a number.

SEGREGATION OF COSTS

Recipients must segregate the obligations and expenditures related to funding under the ARRA. Financial and accounting systems should be revised as necessary to segregate, track and maintain these funds apart and separate from other revenue streams. No part of the funds from the Recovery Act shall be commingled with any other funds or used for a purpose other than that of making payments for costs allowable for ARRA projects.

PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS

None of the funds provided under this agreement derived from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Pub. L. 111-5 may be used by any State or local government, or any private entity, for any casino or other gambling establishment, aquarium, zoo, golf course, or swimming pool.

ACCESS TO RECORDS

ARRA requires recipients of recovery funds to allow representatives of the United States Comptroller General and Office of Inspector General to examine records and interview persons of firms working on Contracts that use ARRA funds. In accordance with Section 902 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009, this Article 2 provides the U.S. Comptroller General and his representatives as appointed under Section 3 or 8G of the Inspector General Act of 1978 (5 U.S.C.APP.) with the authority and rights as provided under Section 1515(b) of the ARRA to:

- (i) examine any records of the contractor or any of its subcontractors, or any State or local agency administering such contract, that directly pertain to, and involve transactions relating to, the contract or subcontract; and,
- (ii) interview any officer or employee of the contractor or any of its subcontractors, or of any State or local government agency administering the contract, regarding such transactions.

Section 1515(b) further states that nothing in this section shall be interpreted to limit or restrict in any way any existing authority of the Comptroller General.

BUY AMERICAN-MADE EQUIPMENT AND PRODUCTS

It is the sense of the Congress that, to the greatest extent practicable, all equipment and products purchased with funds made available under this award should be American-made in accordance with Section 1605 of the ARRA.

*Special Note: Definition of the Provisions entitled, "REQUIRED USE OF AMERICAN IRON, STEEL, AND MANUFACTURED GOODS – SECTION 1605 OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009" and "REQUIRED USE OF AMERICAN IRON, STEEL, AND MANUFACTURED GOODS (COVERED UNDER INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS) – SECTION 1605 OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009" will be done upon definition and review of final activities.

A. REQUIRED USE OF AMERICAN IRON, STEEL, AND MANUFACTURED GOODS — SECTION 1605 OF THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT OF 2009

- (a) Definitions. As used in this award term and condition
 - (1) Manufactured goods means a good brought to the construction site for incorporation into the building or work that has been
 - (i) Processed into a specific form and shape; or
 - (ii) Combined with other raw material to create a material that has different properties than the properties of the individual raw materials.
 - (2) Public building and public work means a public building of, and a public work of, a governmental entity (the United States; the District of Columbia; commonwealths, territories, and minor outlying islands of the United States; State and local governments; and multi-State, regional, or interstate entities which have governmental functions). These buildings and works may include, without limitation, bridges, dams, plants, highways, parkways, streets, subways, tunnels, sewers, mains, power lines, pumping stations, heavy generators, railways, airports, terminals, docks, piers, wharves, ways, lighthouses, buoys, jetties, breakwaters, levees, and

canals, and the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of such buildings and works.

(3) Steel means an alloy that includes at least 50 percent iron, between .02 and 2 percent carbons, and may include other elements.

Designated country iron, steel, and/or manufactured goods —

submitted a written certification to the County that it has not:

- (2) been convicted of an agreement or collusion among bidders or prospective bidders in restraint of freedom of competition, by agreement to bid a fixed price, or otherwise; or
- (3) been convicted of a violation of an environmental law that, in the sole opinion of the County's Purchasing Director, reflects negatively upon the ability of the person or entity to conduct business in a responsible manner; or
- (4) made an admission of guilt of such conduct described in items (1), (2) or (3) above, which is a matter of record, but has not been prosecuted for such conduct, or has made an admission of guilt of such conduct, which is a matter of record, pursuant to formal prosecution. An admission of guilt shall be construed to include a plea of nolo contendere; or
- (5) where an officer, official, agent or employee of a business entity has been convicted of or has admitted guilt to any of the crimes set forth above on behalf of such and entity and pursuant to the direction or authorization of an official thereof (including the person committing the offense, if he is an official of the business entity), the business shall be chargeable with the conduct herein above set forth. A business entity shall be chargeable with the conduct of an affiliated entity, whether wholly owned, partially owned, or one which has common ownership or a common Board of Directors. For purposes of this Form, business entities are affiliated if, directly or indirectly, one business entity controls or has the power to control another business entity, or if an individual or group of individuals controls or has the power to control both entities. Indicia of control shall include, without limitation, interlocking management or ownership, identity of interests among family members, shared organization of a business entity following the ineligibility of a business entity under this

Article, or using substantially the same management, ownership or principles as the ineligible entity.

Any person or entity who claims that this Article is inapplicable to him/her/it because a conviction or judgment has been reversed by a court of competent jurisdiction, shall prove the same with documentation satisfactory to the County's Purchasing Director. Upon presentation of such satisfactory proof, the person or entity shall be allowed to contract with the County.
