EVALUATION RESULTS:

The Evaluation Committee convened on September 23, 2013 to review evaluation committee responsibilities, discuss member's availability for future meetings and the Sunshine Law as applicable to public meetings. During this meeting the committee reviewed the proposals submitted on September 10, 2013 in response to the Employee Health Plan Consulting Services RFP and short-listed the following firms to make oral presentations.

Aon-Hewitt, Tampa, FL Gallagher Benefit Services Inc., Tampa, FL Towers Watson, Tampa, FL

The Evaluation Committee convened on October 18, 2013 to hear the Oral Presentation from each short-listed firm and to discuss the offers based on the stated requirements in the RFP and consider the information brought forth at the oral presentations, continuing the acquisition process and develop a recommendation to the County Administrator.

Aon Hewitt, Tampa, FL – The firm presented its professional capabilities in a clear and concise manner via their proposal and continued to show these capabilities during the oral presentation. Of particular importance was: the firm's ability to provide the necessary reports in a clear and concise manner for the Board of County Commissioners, County Administration and Employee Health Benefits Division staff; successful past performance with the County and a reasonable pricing structure for required tasks. Additionally, Aon Hewitt proposed an Account Manager who specializes in Health and Welfare networks providing added expertise in that area.

Towers Watson, Tampa, FL – The firm submitted an informative proposal detailing their qualifications and its oral presentation created an informative exchange of ideas. The firm is a respected company in the industry and proposed an accomplished Account Executive to manage the Manatee County account. While impressed with the firm's qualifications Towers Watson was evaluated second by the Evaluation Committee as they had a lesser volume of public sector clients and their extensive reporting was not what the County likely required.

Gallagher Benefit Services Inc., Tampa, FL – Gallagher Benefit Services Inc. submitted a satisfactory proposal and made a good presentation with their team detailing its knowledge of the industry. Other favorable points were their high volume of public sector clients and knowledge of future health reform requirements. However, the Evaluation Committee presumed weak actuarial services ability and did not evaluate the firm higher.

The County's primary objective is to obtain the services of a qualified firm to assist with annual consulting for our benefit programs including its self funded health plans as well as any future insured products that we might offer. The County offers a unique health plan designed to drive members to better care through preventative, evidence-based medicine. Additionally, the County provides an onsite, integrated Team of clinical professionals to offer coaching and guidance to the members of the plan. This same team also performs all Utilization Management, Care Management, Disease Management and Wellness functions, through the agreement with Aetna.

Aon Hewitt, Tampa, FL – The firm presented its professional capabilities in a clear and concise manner via their proposal and continued to show these capabilities during the oral presentation. Of particular importance was: the firm's ability to provide the necessary reports in a clear and concise manner for the Board of County Commissioners, County Administration and Employee Health Benefits Division staff; successful past performance with the County and a reasonable pricing structure for required tasks. Additionally, Aon Hewitt proposed an Account Manager who specializes in Health and Welfare networks providing added expertise in that area.
