EVALUATION RESULTS:

The Evaluation Committee (the "Committee") convened on July 1, 2014 to review evaluation committee responsibilities and the Florida Sunshine Law as applicable to public meetings. The Evaluation Committee then proceeded to review each of the two (2) proposals for their responsiveness to the requirements of the RFP. As a result of the discussion, the Committee unanimously voted and recommended a Intent to Negotiate Award for Ayres Associates, Inc. to the County Administrator.

Ayres Associates, Inc.

Ayres Associates, Inc. demonstrated exceptional qualifications by means of their proposal. Their submitted proposal was responsive and responsible, meeting all necessary criteria set forth in the RFP. Ayres Associates, Inc. has office locations in Tampa and Sarasota, with nine (9) additional offices in five (5) different states. One of the desired components of Ayres Associates, Inc. proposal was their specialization and relevant past work experience with TSMA inspections. Additionally, Ayres Associates, Inc. provided a very strong project approach and listed a series of frequently asked questions regarding TSMA inspections along with their subsequent answers. This provided evidence that Ayres Associates, Inc. has an exceptionally strong foundational knowledge regarding the delivery of the intended services. This specific knowledge coupled with the strength of key personnel and relevant past experience renders Ayres Associates, Inc. a desirable and strong candidate.

Volkert, Inc.

Volkert, Inc. demonstrated a strong project approach by means of their proposal. Their submitted proposal was both responsive and meeting all necessary criteria set forth in the RFP. The Evaluation Committee noted that a majority of the experience presented by specialized in Bridge Inspection as opposed to the Traffic Signal Mast Arm Inspection experience outlined in the RFP. As a result, the ranked Volkert, Inc. second.

ESTIMATED COST OF SERVICES: The estimated annual expenditure is \$30,000.
