A.06 LEGAL NAME

Proposals shall clearly indicate the legal name, address, email and telephone number of the proposer (company, firm, partnership, individual). Proposals shall be signed above the typed or printed name and title of the signer. The signer must have the authority to bind the proposer to the submitted proposal.

A.07 PROPOSAL EXPENSES

All expenses for making proposals to the County are to be borne by the proposer.

A.08 EXAMINATION OF PROPOSAL

The examination of the proposal and the proposer generally requires a period of not less than ninety (90) calendar days from the date of the opening of the proposals.

A.09 DISCLOSURE

Upon receipt, all inquiries and responses to inquiries related to this Request for Proposal become "Public Records" and are subject to public disclosure consistent with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

Proposals become subject to disclosure thirty (30) days after the Opening or if a notice of intended award decision is made earlier than this time as provided by Florida Statute 119.071(1)(b). No announcement of review of the offer shall be conducted at the public opening. If the County rejects all offers and concurrently notices its intent to reissue the solicitation, initial offers are exempt until the County provides notice of its intended decision or, thirty (30) days after the opening of the new offers.

A.10 ERRORS OR OMISSIONS

Once a proposal is submitted, the County shall not accept any request by any proposer to correct errors or omissions in the proposal.

A.11 <u>DISQUALIFICATION DUE TO NON-RESPONSIVENESS:</u>

Manatee County reserves the right to find that any proposal received which does not contain all of the information, attachments, verification, forms or other information may be considered non responsive and therefore be disqualified from eligibility to proceed further in the RFP process.

A.12 RESERVED RIGHTS

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response received by the first submission date may or may not be rejected by the County, depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. The County reserves the right to award the contract to a responsible proposer submitting a responsive proposal, with a resulting negotiated agreement which is most advantageous and in the best interests of the County. The County shall be the sole judge of the proposal, and the resulting negotiated agreement that is in its best interest and its decision shall be final. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any proposer to perform the work or service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the proposer. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to: current financial statements prepared by an independent CPA; verification of availability of equipment and personnel; and past performance records.

A.13 APPLICABLE LAWS

Upon receipt, all inquiries and responses to inquiries related to this Request for Proposal become "Public Records" and are subject to public disclosure consistent with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

A.14 CODE OF ETHICS

With respect to this proposal, if any Proposer violates, directly or indirectly, the ethics provisions of the Manatee County Purchasing Code and/or Florida criminal or civil laws related to public procurement, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 112, Part II, Code of Ethics for Public Division and Employees, such Proposer will be disqualified from eligibility to perform the work described in this Request for Proposal, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids or proposals to supply goods or services to, Manatee County. By submitting a proposal, the Proposer represents to the County that all statements made and materials submitted are truthful, with no relevant facts withheld.

A.14 CODE OF ETHICS(continued)

If a Proposer is determined to have been untruthful in its proposal or any related presentation, such Proposer will be disqualified from eligibility to perform the work described in this Request for Proposal, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids or proposals to supply goods or services to, Manatee County.

A.15 COLLUSION

By offering a submission to this Request For Proposal the proposer certifies the proposer has not divulged to, discussed or compared his proposal with other proposers and has not colluded with any other proposer or parties to this proposal whatsoever. Also, the proposer certifies, and in the case of a joint proposal, each party thereto certifies, as to their own organization that in connection with this proposal:

- a. any prices and/or data submitted have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices and/or cost data, with any other proposer or with any competitor:
- b. any prices and/or cost data quoted for this proposal have not been knowingly disclosed by the proposer prior to the scheduled opening directly or indirectly to any competitor;
- no attempt has been made or will be made by the proposer to induce any other person or firm to submit or not to submit a proposal for the purpose of restricting competition;
- d. the only person or persons interested in this proposal as principal or principals is/are named therein and that no person other than therein mentioned has any interest in this proposal or in the contract to be entered into; and
- e. no person or agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees.

A.16 PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

In accordance with Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, a person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a proposal on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a proposal on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit proposals on leases or real property to a public entity,

may not be awarded or perform work as a Contractor, supplier, subContractor, or Consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017 for Category Two for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

In addition, Manatee Code Chapter 2-26 Article V prohibits the award of County contracts to any person or entity who/which has, within the past 5 years, been convicted of, or admitted to in court or sworn to under oath, a public entity crime or of any environmental law that, in the reasonable opinion of the Purchasing Official, establishes reasonable grounds to believe the person or business entity will not conduct business in a reasonable manner.

To ensure compliance with the foregoing, the Code requires all persons or entities desiring to contract with the County to execute and file with the Purchasing Official an affidavit, executed under the pain and penalties of perjury, confirming that person, entity, and any person(s) affiliated with the entity, does not have such a record and is therefore eligible to seek and be awarded business with the County. **Proposer is to complete Attachment "B"**

A.17 LOBBYING

After the issuance of any Request For Proposals, prospective proposers or any agent, representative or person acting at the request of such proposer shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating in any way to the Request For Proposals with any Division, agent or employee of Manatee County other than the Purchasing Official or as directed in the Request For Proposals. This prohibition begins with the issuance of any Request For Proposals and ends upon an award of the final contract, when all solicitations have been rejected, or when the request has been canceled. Violators of this prohibition shall be subject to sanctions as provided in the Manatee County Code of Law Chapter 2-26.

SECTION B: SCOPE OF SERVICES

B.01 PURPOSE

With the progress of IP-based telephony and the advancements in public network switching systems, old wire-type telephone systems have become obsolete. One of the last vestiges of the technology has been the public 911 network for delivering 911 calls to "public safety answering points" Public Safety Answering Position (PSAPs). Unlike conventional IP telephone systems the 911 network or "nextgen 911", architecture is unique to PSAPs and is uniquely complex in the way information about the caller is delivered to the PSAP.

B.01.1 Background Information:

The following background information is not meant to be an all-inclusive description of what Manatee County is currently using to handle its 911 calls, but rather a general and high level description of current systems. Manatee County is currently utilizing a Cassidian Vesta call-taking system at its primary PSAP location and which is a computer-telephony call center application connected to a Nortel M1 switching platform and NICE call logging equipment, also at the primary PSAP location.

The primary system is a 2,000 port system with remote shelf operations using Nortel Mini Remote shelves at three secondary PSAP locations at the City of Bradenton Police Department, the City of Palmetto Police Department, and the Town of Longboat Key Police Department. All equipment and infrastructure except the NICE call logging recorder was provided by Verizon in 2006. Until last year all maintenance and preventative maintenance was provided by Verizon, but the County assumed this maintenance beginning in October, 2011.

The NICE call logger is under a separate maintenance agreement with Replay Systems. A "display board" system is also in use in the call center and was provided by Symon primarily because the Vesta system did not contain an audible queue overflow alarm that could be sounded in the call center when calls are waiting, and this much needed feature was achieved with the addition of these display boards.

911 calls are delivered over T1 lines leased from Verizon as TR350-type analog modified DID trunks provided by the regulated side of Verizon. Trunk groups are split into four distinct types:

- wireless from main tandem
- wireline from main tandem
- wireless from secondary tandem
- wireline from secondary tandem

B.01.1 Background Information (continued)

Administrative lines are provided by the state network (centrex DID (direct inward dial), ringdown, others) and connect the PSAPs to neighboring PSAPs, hospitals in Manatee and Sarasota County, and admin lines in other agencies. Automatic location information is provided by Verizon in the classic mode of two 4800 baud modems with record information coming from two separate Verizon databases. The cost for record maintenance and database access is also charged by Verizon.

For backup, the County has constructed a large bus-type vehicle similar to a command vehicle used by law enforcement. This unit is typically tethered to an "answer point" immediately adjacent to the call center and can be accessed by dispatchers in just a few minutes. It is kept hot, tested weekly, and is ready to go at a moment's notice via a transfer switch to reroute 911 calls to the bus. This bus may also be driven to a second location where a separate additional tether point is located and 911 calls can be routed to this point via a re-route request to Verizon. The unit is equipped with 16 positions, radios at twelve positions, and a non-CAD based mapping system. This vehicle literally serves as a fully mobile complete PSAP.

The NICE call logger is attached to both stations and trunks, and also is attached to the trunked Harris 800 mghz radio system through the TRIM option in the radio. The NICE system is considered obsolete and will be replaced with the next generation system.

B.02 SCOPE OF SERVICES

The County requires the services of a qualified Consultant to perform the following services as the County prepares for nextgen 911:

- B.02.1 Perform a needs assessment based on the technical and the community of first responders in Manatee County. This includes a physical review of all current systems and technologies, a review of all inter-agency systems (cities, county, Sheriff Office, fire, franchised telephone company(s) and other carriers, etc.) and understanding of how these work interactively today with present technology.
- B.02.2 Produce a specification, with County input, that will be utilized in the County development of a competitive Request For Proposal to be utilized in the selection of a Contractor to supply and install the specified technology.
- B.02.3 Assist the County Evaluation Committee in the review of all proposals received and provide a written assessment of each.

B.03 MEETING REQUIREMENTS DURING DOCUMENT DEVELOPMENT

The proposal will provide an estimate of the number of meetings the Consultant shall attend. At a minimum the following meetings will be attended:

- a. One kick-off work session to be held with County staff to review the scope of work, schedule and procedures.
- b. After initial draft document is prepared, the Consultant shall attend the next County meeting for input from County staff.
- c. The Consultant shall include in his proposal time for a meeting with County staff to review status of work. The meetings scheduled may be modified with mutual consent of the Consultant and County staff. This can occur over the phone.
- d. The Consultant shall include in his proposal the attendance of one joint workshop to be held with the Board of County Commissioners and County staff regarding the final draft.

B.04 MEETING REQUIREMENTS DURING CONSTRUCTION

The proposal shall provide an estimate of the number of meetings the Consultant will attend to include at a minimum the following meetings:

- a. Consultant shall during construction be required to attend an initial "Kick Off" meeting and no less than two (2) weekly progress meetings and possible conference call meetings when required with the Contractor and County Staff.
- b. Consultant will within five (5) calendar days of the latest meeting attended by the Consultant produce and submit to the County staff a written report as to the acceptability of the Contractors progress.
- c. Consultant shall provide no less than two (2) site visits to observe the Contractor's installation of equipment.
- d. Consultant will meet with the County Project Manager by phone or in person to discuss and review the Contractor's requests for change orders, if any, and the Contractor's latest monthly request for payment and shall either approve and sign the request or disapprove the request with a written explanation as to why it has been disapproved.
- e. Consultant shall conduct a punch list site visit with the County Project Manager and reduce the list to writing for distribution to the Contractor, the Director of Public Safety and the County Project Manager.

B.04 MEETING REQUIREMENTS DURING CONSTRUCTION(continued)

f. Consultant and the County Project Manager shall conduct a final inspection and walk through of the facility along with any County Staff that is deemed necessary to be present. The Consultant shall be required to issue and execute a Certificate of Substantial Completion once the Consultant and the County Project Manager are satisfied the project is complete and ready for County use.

SECTION C: FORM OF PROPOSAL

This section identifies specific information which must be contained within each proposal. The contents of each proposal shall be <u>separated</u> and <u>arranged with tabs</u> in the same order as listed in <u>Sections C.01, through C.05</u>, identifying the response to each specific item.

The information that you provide shall be used to determine those Proposers with perceived ability to perform the Scope of Services as stated in this Request for Proposal which may overall best meet the needs of Manatee County. A review with those Proposers reasonably susceptible of being selected for award shall be conducted for the purposes of clarification of both ability and benefit to Manatee County. See Section D: Selection.

C.01 MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

The Proposer must present qualifications as follows prior to further consideration of their proposal:

- A. Proposals may be submitted by one (1) or more sole proprietorship, corporation, partnership or a joint venture, the entity(ies) submitting the proposal shall be properly registered, certified, and licensed as required by the State of Florida and include copies of such registration, certification and licensing in the proposal to provide the services required by this document.
- B Proposers intending to submit a proposal as a Joint Venture are required to have filed proper documents with the Florida Department of State, the Division of Professions, and any other state or local licensing agency prior to submitting the proposal.

Joint Venture Firms must provide an affidavit on the firms letterhead, signed, witnessed and notarized attesting to the formulation of a joint venture and provide either proof of incorporation or a copy of the formal agreement between all joint venture parties, indicating their respective roles, responsibilities and levels of participation for the project.

Prior to any consideration of the responses to the criteria in this Request For Proposal If the proposer is relying on any acquisition or merger for meeting the minimum qualifications requirement, the proposer shall clearly disclose such acquisition or merger. After Manatee County staff validates the qualifications given, those proposers who meet the minimum qualifications stated above will be considered.

C.03 INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED REGARDING PROPOSER(S)

Tabs are required to identify each item defined in this Section.

To validate the qualifying service, provide the Florida city or county, the date of the engagement, a government contact who was responsible for the administration of that contract and contact information including telephone and email information.

- C.03.1. Provide a description of the proposer's **background and size**. Provide a general statement of qualifications that includes your firm's credentials, the legal status of your organization, and experience in providing the service enumerated in this Request For Proposal.
- C.03.2. Provide an **explanation of the business entity which you represent**.

Specify the business entity which would be bound by an Agreement, should your firm be selected provide information relevant to your company or corporation; Subcontractor roles, if any; and if a joint venture, include the specific experience that the joint venture partners have working together on similar projects.

If the proposer is a joint venture, or partnership, the details of the responsibilities for provision of the required services must be clearly disclosed. Provide a narrative on how you anticipate the partnerships to manage the work and any prior experience that the individual entities may have had in working together on other projects. Include the name of the entity the work was completed for, a description of the services provided, the dates of service and the name(s) and telephone number(s) of the contact persons. This list shall be for both Governmental and Private clients for the past five (5) years.

C.03.4. Identify each **principal of the firm and other "key personnel"** who will be professionally associated with the County. Do not include personnel that will not have a key role in providing services. Describe their respective areas of expertise.

For the remaining key personnel detail at what location(s) they will work from and how they will provide management or service or supply support from the locations that they will work from.
- C.03.6 Disclose any ownership interest in other entities involved in Next Generation 911 services which may be a potential participant in this Request for Proposals. This ownership disclosure shall be included, whether such ownership occurs by the proposer through a parent, subsidiary or holding company or any other form of business entity. Submit entity names and the percent of ownership for each.
- C.03.7 Submit a list of **subContractors and sub-Consultants** that may be used with the same level of detail as item C.03.4 above.
- C.03.8 Submit a narrative explaining the direct economic benefit to Manatee County to be realized by selecting your firm. During the term of this engagement detail the revenue maximizing activities, employment, subcontracting, and support services contracting as economic stimulus that your entity may generate that would directly benefit Manatee County.

C.04 ESTIMATED PROJECT COSTS

Proposer shall provide a cost proposal using the Section B Scope of Services for the project with detailed costs for the identified tasks based on the information provided within this Request For Proposal. The elements of the proposed cost shall be developed and presented as follows:

The elements of the proposed cost shall be developed utilizing the staff required for the project and their individual hourly rates of compensation including all overhead, payroll taxes, insurance, workman's compensation, benefits etc. and all profit. C.05 ADDITIONAL INFORMATION NOT REQUESTED

Submit any other additional information which would assist the County in the evaluation of your proposal.

The County reserves the right to make any investigation and solicit additional information or submittals as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any Proposer to perform the Scope of Services stated in this Request for Proposal.

SECTION D: SELECTION

D.01 EVALUATION FACTORS

Evaluation of proposals will be conducted by an evaluation committee. The committee's goal will be to identify the proposal which will overall best meet the needs of Manatee County as determined from the proposals received and subsequent investigation by the County.

D.02 PRELIMINARY RANKING

An evaluation committee shall determine from the responses to this Request for Proposals and subsequent investigation as necessary, the Proposer(s) most qualified to be selected to negotiate an agreement.

D.03 REVIEW OF PROPOSERS AND PROPOSALS

In-person reviews may be conducted with responsible proposers who are deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award, for the purposes of assuring full understanding of (a) conformance to the solicitation requirements, (b) the abilities of the proposer, and (c) the proposal submitted.

Proposers shall be available for presentations to and interviews with the evaluation committee, upon reasonable notification from the Purchasing Division. The date(s) and time(s) of any such presentations / interviews shall be determined solely by the County, and may be closed to the public in the discretion of the Purchasing Official, and to the extent permitted by law.

D.04 SELECTION FOR NEGOTIATION

The Evaluation Committee will make a recommendation to the County Administrator as to the proposer the County should enter negotiations with. The County Administrator will act upon that recommendation and, if accepted, the successful Proposer will be invited to enter negotiations led by the Purchasing Division.

D.05 AWARD

Award of an agreement is subject to the successful negotiations and the approval of either the County Administrator or the Board of County Commissioners (as provided for in the current Purchasing Code and Procurement Procedures).

SECTION E: NEGOTIATION OF THE AGREEMENT

E.01 GENERAL

The following general terms and conditions apply to the proposal submitted for consideration and the subsequent negotiations:

- a. The proposal will serve as a basis for negotiating an agreement.
- b. Upon submission, all proposals become the property of the County which has the right to use any or all ideas presented in any proposal submitted in response to this Request for Proposal whether or not the proposal is accepted.
- c. Pursuant to Section "E" thru negotiations the Agreement shall remain in effect for a period established thru mutual agreement of both parties.
- d. All products and papers produced in the course of this engagement become the property of the County upon termination or completion of the engagement.

E.02 AGREEMENT

The selected proposer(s) shall be required to negotiate an agreement, in a form and with provisions acceptable to Manatee County.

Negotiated Agreements may or may not include all elements of this RFP or the resulting successful proposal where alternative terms or conditions become more desirable to the County, and the parties agree to such terms.

The parties will negotiate the term of the agreement, and the circumstances in which it may be renewed, assigned or terminated.

The parties will negotiate matters of insurance, liability, record-keeping, auditing, and all other relevant contractual matters.

MANATEE COUNTY LOCAL PREFERENCE LAW AND VENDOR REGISTRATION

SECTION.01 Vendor Registration

All vendors are encouraged to register with Manatee County using the on-line "Vendor Registration" web page on www.mymanatee.org.

Enclosed is a copy of the current Manatee County law that details the County's Local Preference and definition of a Local Business.

If you assert that your firm meets the stated definition of a Local Business, we ask that in addition to registering on the County's Web page, you fill out the attached "Affidavit As To Local Business Form" that is the last page in this section of the proposal, have the completed document notarized, and mail the original to the following address: Manatee County Administration Center, 1112 Manatee Avenue West, Suite 803, Bradenton, FL 34205.

Your cooperation in registering your business with Manatee County will enhance our opportunities to identify sources for goods and services, plus identify Local Businesses. This information is used for soliciting quotations up to \$250,000.00 and for competitive solicitations of larger purchases.

You will note that Manatee County collaborates with the Manatee Chamber of Commerce, posting bids on www.manateechamber.com as well as using the same vendor categories for registration. Our staff can assist you with your registration as needed. Our office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday on regular business days. MANATEE COUNTY LOCAL PREFERENCE LAW AND VENDOR REGISTRATION

SECTION.02 / Section 2-26-6. Local preference, tie bids, local business defined.

- (a) Whenever a responsible local business bidder and a responsible non-local business bidder are found, upon the opening of bids, to have both submitted the lowest responsive bid, the bid of the local bidder shall be awarded the contract. Should more than one responsible local business bidder match the responsible non-local business bidder's lowest responsive bid, or should no responsible local business bidders submit lowest responsive bid but two or more responsible non-local business bidders submit lowest responsive bids for equal amounts, then the award of the contract shall be determined by a chance drawing, coin toss, or similar tie-breaking method conducted by the purchasing office and open to the public. Any bidders seeking to be recognized as local businesses for purposes of this local business preference provision may be required by the terms of the bid announcement to certify they meet the definition of local business set forth in this section, and to register as a local business with the county in the manner prescribed by the county to facilitate the county's ability to track the award of contracts to local businesses and to allow the county to provide future notifications to its local businesses concerning other bidding opportunities.
- (b) Nothing herein shall be deemed to prohibit the inclusion of requirements with respect to operating and maintaining a local place of business in any invitation for bids when the bidder's location materially affects the provisions of the services or supplies that are required by the invitation.
- (c) Local business is defined as a business legally authorized to engage in the sale of the goods and/or services to be procured, and which certifies within its bid that for at least six (6) months prior to the announcement of the solicitation of bids it has maintained a physical place of business in Manatee, Desoto, Hardee, Hillsborough, Pinellas or Sarasota County with at least one full-time employees at that location.
- (d) Each solicitation for bids made by the county shall contain terms expressly describing the local business preference policies of the county, and shall provide that by electing to submit a bid pursuant to a request for bids, all bidders are deemed to understand and agree to those policies.
- (e) For all contracts for architecture, professional engineering, or other professional services governed by Florida Statute § 287.055, the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act, the county shall include the local business status of a firm among the factors considered when selecting which firms are "most highly qualified." In determining which firm is the "most qualified" for purposes of negotiating a satisfactory contract, preference shall be given to a local business where all other relevant factors are equal.
- (f) Local preference shall not apply to the following categories of contracts:
 - 1. Goods or services provided under a cooperative purchasing agreement or similar "piggyback" contract;
 - 2. Contracts for professional services subject to Florida Statute § 287.055, the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act, except as provided for in subsection (e) above;

SECTION.02/Section 2-26-6. Local preference, (CONTINUED)

Local preference shall not apply to the following categories of contracts continued)

- 3. Purchases or contracts which are funded, in whole or in part, by a governmental or other funding entity, where the terms and conditions of receipt of the funds prohibit the preference;
- 4. Purchases or contracts made pursuant to a non-competitive award process, unless otherwise provided by this section;
- 5. Any bid announcement which specifically provides that the general local preference policies set forth in this section are suspended due to the unique nature of the goods or services sought, the existence of an emergency as found by either the county commission or county administrator, or where such suspension is, in the opinion of the county attorney, required by law.
- (g) To qualify for local preference under this section, a local business must certify to the County that it:
 - 1. Has not within the five years prior to the bid announcement admitted guilt or been found guilty by any court or state or federal regulatory enforcement agency of violation of any criminal law, or a law or administrative regulation regarding fraud;
 - 2. Is not currently subject to an unresolved citation or notice of violation of any Manatee County Code provision, except citations or notices which are the subject of a current legal appeal, as of the date of the bid announcement:
 - 3. Is not delinquent in the payment of any fines, liens, assessments, fees or taxes to any governmental unit or taxing authority within Manatee County, except any such sums which are the subject of a current legal appeal.
