SECTION A: INFORMATION TO PROPOSERS

PROPOSERS MUST COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS TO BE CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION.

A.01 OPENING LOCATION

These proposals will be <u>publicly opened</u> at Manatee County Purchasing Division, 1112 Manatee Avenue West, 8th Floor, Suite 803, Bradenton, Florida 34205, in the presence of County officials at the time and date stated on the cover sheet. All Proposers or their representatives are invited to attend.

A.02 PROPOSAL INFORMATION AND PROPOSAL DOCUMENTS

Bid or Proposal documents and the Notices of Source Selection related to those Bids or Proposals are available for download in a portable document format (.PDF) file on the Manatee County web page on the Purchasing tab under "<u>Bids and Proposals</u>". You may view and print these files using Adobe Acrobat software. You may download a free copy of this software (Adobe) from the County's web page if you do not have it.

This step is in addition to the posting on Manatee County Government web pages.

Participation in the DemandStar system is not a requirement for doing business with Manatee County.

Note: The County posts the **Notice of Source Selection** seven (7) calendar days prior to COMMENCING NEGOTIATIONS with the selected firms.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH PROPOSER, PRIOR TO SUBMITTING THEIR PROPOSAL, TO CONTACT THE MANATEE COUNTY PURCHASING DIVISION (see contact information on page one of this document) TO DETERMINE IF ADDENDA WERE ISSUED AND TO MAKE SUCH ADDENDA A PART OF THEIR PROPOSAL.

A.03 REQUIREMENTS FOR FORMAT AND DELIVERY OF PROPOSALS

Any proposals received after the stated time and date will not be considered. It shall be the sole responsibility of the Proposer to have their proposal delivered to the Manatee County Purchasing Division for receipt on or before the stated time and date. If a proposal is sent by U.S. Mail, the Proposer shall be responsible for its timely delivery to the Purchasing Division. Proposals delayed by mail shall not be considered, shall not be opened at the public opening, and arrangements shall be made for their return at the Proposer's request and expense.

Proposals must be submitted in the format specified in Section C hereof. The contents of each proposal shall be **separated and arranged with tabs in the same order as listed in the Subsections within Section C** identifying the response to each specific item thereby facilitating expedient review of all responses.

A.04 CLARIFICATION & ADDENDA

Each Proposer shall examine all Request for Proposal documents and shall judge all matters relating to the adequacy and accuracy of such documents. Any inquiries, suggestions or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to the Request for Proposal shall be made in writing through the Manatee County Purchasing Division. The County shall not be responsible for oral interpretations given by any County employee, representative, or agent. The issuance of a written addendum by the Purchasing Official's Division is the only official method whereby interpretation, clarification or additional information can be given.

It shall be the responsibility of each Proposer, prior to submitting their proposal, to contact the Manatee County Purchasing Office at (941)748-4501, ext. 3014 to determine if addenda were issued and to make such addenda a part of the proposal.

A.05 SEALED & MARKED

A.06 LEGAL NAME

Proposals shall clearly indicate the legal name, address and telephone number of the Proposer (company, firm, partnership, individual). Proposals shall be signed above the typed or printed name and title of the signer. The signer shall have the authority to bind the Proposer to the submitted proposal.

A.07 PROPOSAL EXPENSES

All expenses for making proposals to the County are to be borne by the Proposer.

A.08 EXAMINATION OF OFFER

The examination of the proposal and the Proposer generally requires a period of not less than ninety (90) calendar days from the date of the opening of the proposals.

A.09 DISCLOSURE

Upon receipt, all inquiries and responses to inquiries related to this Request for Proposal become "Public Records" and are subject to public disclosure consistent with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes.

Proposals become subject to disclosure thirty (30) days after the Opening or if a notice of intended award decision is made earlier than this time as provided by Florida Statute 119.071(1)(b). No announcement of review of the offer shall be conducted at the public opening. If the County rejects all offers and concurrently notices its intent to reissue the solicitation, initial offers are exempt until the County provides notice of its intended decision or, thirty (30) days after the opening of the new offers.

A.10 ERRORS OR OMISSIONS

Once a proposal is submitted, the County shall not accept any request by any Proposer to correct errors or omissions in the proposal.

A.11 DISQUALIFICATION DUE TO NON-RESPONSIVENESS:

Manatee County reserves the right to find that any proposal received which does not contain all of the information, attachments, verification, forms or other information may be considered non responsive and therefore be disqualified from eligibility to proceed further in the RFP process.

A.12 RESERVED RIGHTS

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all proposals, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Any sole response received by the first submission date may or may not be rejected by the County, depending on available competition and timely needs of the County. The County reserves the right to award the contract to a responsible Proposer submitting a responsive proposal, with a resulting negotiated agreement which is most advantageous and in the best interests of the County. The County shall be the sole judge of the proposal, and the resulting negotiated agreement that is in its best interest and its decision shall be final. Also, the County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any Proposer to perform the work or service requested. Information the County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the Proposer. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to: current financial statements prepared by an independent CPA; verification of availability of equipment and personnel; and past performance records.

A.13 APPLICABLE LAWS

Proposer must be authorized to transact business in the State of Florida. All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Florida and ordinances and regulations of Manatee County will apply to any resulting agreement. Any involvement with any Manatee County procurement shall be in accordance with Manatee County Code Chapter 2-26. Procedures and deadlines concerning protests related to this Request for Proposals shall be those which are set forth in § 2-26-61 of the County Code.

A.14 CODE OF ETHICS

With respect to this proposal, if any Proposer violates, directly or indirectly, the ethics provisions of the Manatee County Purchasing Code and/or Florida criminal or civil laws related to public procurement, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 112, Part II, Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, such Proposer will be disqualified from eligibility to perform the work described in this Request for Proposal, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids or proposals to supply goods or services to, Manatee County.

By submitting a proposal, the Proposer represents to the County that all statements made and materials submitted are truthful, with no relevant facts withheld. If a Proposer is determined to have been untruthful in its proposal or any related presentation, such Proposer will be disqualified from eligibility to perform the work described in this Request for Proposal, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids or proposals to supply goods or services to, Manatee County.

A.15 COLLUSION

By offering a submission to this Request for Proposal the Proposer certifies the Proposer has not divulged to, discussed or compared his proposal with other Proposers and has not colluded with any other Proposer or parties to this proposal whatsoever. Also, the Proposer certifies, and in the case of a joint proposal, each party thereto certifies, as to their own organization that in connection with this proposal:

- a. any prices and/or data submitted have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices and/or cost data, with any other Proposer or with any competitor;
- any prices and/or cost data quoted for this proposal have not been knowingly disclosed by the Proposer prior to the scheduled opening directly or indirectly to any competitor;
- no attempt has been made or will be made by the Proposer to induce any other person or firm to submit or not to submit a proposal for the purpose of restricting competition;
- d. the only person or persons interested in this proposal as principal or principals is/are named therein and that no person other than therein mentioned has any interest in this proposal or in the contract to be entered into; and
- e. no person or agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, excepting bona fide employees.

A.16 PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

In accordance with Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, a person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a proposal on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a proposal on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit proposals on leases or real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017 for Category Two for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.

In addition, Manatee Code of Laws Chapter 2-26 Article V prohibits the award of County contracts to any person or entity who/which has, within the past 5 years, been convicted of, or admitted to in court or sworn to under oath, a public entity crime or of any environmental law that, in the reasonable opinion of the purchasing official, establishes reasonable grounds to believe the person or business entity will not conduct business in a reasonable manner.

To ensure compliance with the foregoing, the Code requires all persons or entities desiring to contract with the County to execute and file with the purchasing official an affidavit, executed under the pain and penalties of perjury, confirming that person, entity, and any person(s) affiliated with the entity, does not have such a record and is therefore eligible to seek and be awarded business with the County. **Proposer is to complete Attachment "A" and submit with your proposal.**

A.17 LOBBYING

After the issuance of any Request For Proposals, prospective Proposers or any agent, representative or person acting at the request of such Proposer shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating in any way to the Request For Proposals with any officer, agent or employee of Manatee County other than the Purchasing Official or as directed in the Request For Proposals. This prohibition begins with the issuance of any Request for Proposals and ends upon an award of the final contract, when all solicitations have been rejected, or when the request has been canceled. Violators of this prohibition shall be subject to sanctions as provided in the Manatee County Code of Law Chapter 2-26.

A.18 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

In accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and Title 15, Part 8 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Manatee County hereby notifies all prospective Proposers that they will affirmatively ensure minority business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to participate in response to this advertisement and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color or national origin in consideration for an award of contract.

A.19 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Board of County Commissioners of Manatee County, Florida, does not discriminate upon the basis of any individual's disability status. This non-discrimination policy involves every aspect of the County's functions including one's access to, participation, employment, or treatment in its programs or activities. Anyone requiring reasonable accommodation for the **public meetings** specified herein (i.e. Information Conference or Proposal Opening), should contact the person named on the first page of this document at least twenty four (24) hours in advance of the activity to request accommodations.

SECTION B: SCOPE OF SERVICES

B.01 BACKGROUND AND INTRODUCTION

Manatee County ("County") through its Information Technology Division ("IT") provides services to satisfy the voice and data needs of all County departments in an effort to better serve the citizens of Manatee County quickly and efficiently. These services include the provision and support of Countywide networks, desktop computers, numerous business applications, County and departmental Internet and Intranet sites, as well as telephone communications. The County IT staff currently handles the majority of support of telephony systems utilizing County staff and contracts with an outside vendor to provide 2nd tier maintenance and technical support when necessary.

The County telecommunication system is situated in 25 primary locations within Manatee County. It is a voice network consisting of NEC PBXs and key systems: multiple voice mail servers, a call accounting system, and various fiber, data and other network equipment; all connected either by conduits, fiber optics, copper cables, or leased circuits. There are approximately 5000 users which include the Board of County Commissioners, Manatee County Sheriff's Office, Clerk of the Circuit Court, Supervisor of Elections, Manatee County Property Appraiser, Public Attorney Office, and State Attorney Office. A wide variety of terminal equipment is employed to meet end user needs, including proprietary NEC analog and digital sets, conference speakerphones, Automatic Call Distribution (ACD), miscellaneous paging systems, public address, and other systems.

The purpose of this RFP is to obtain from qualified firms, their experience, qualifications, and pricing to assist the County in upgrading its telecommunications system. The goal is to contract with a telephone and data communications consultant, that is vendor independent, to evaluate the County's existing environment and needs, provide recommendations, and deliver a complete bidding package to upgrade or replace the current telephony systems.

B.02 SCOPE OF SERVICES

It is the intent to contract with a consulting firm with NO vested interest in a specific technology or equipment provider. Proposers shall clearly identify any potential conflict of interest in their submittal (reference Attachment D, Affidavit of No Conflict). The successful Proposer would be ineligible to submit a proposal on any project resulting from their recommendation relating to this agreement.

The successful Proposer shall be responsible for the following Tasks to be performed in phases as described below. To accomplish these Tasks, it is the successful Proposer's responsibility to access and conduct an analysis, including history, of the existing telecommunication and data communication systems using all information necessary to:

- B.02.1 Maximize the existing technologies.
- B.02.2 Improve caller experience, i.e. auto-attendant, phone queues and voice mail system. Improve operations, i.e. activity and utilization reports, live queue status, call processing and message processing of voice and fax.
- B.02.3 Minimize vendors and equipment platforms. Reduce operational and maintenance cost, i.e. telephone circuits and equipment replacement.
- B.02.4 Use Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) technologies at the Desktop to reduce MAC costs. For future enhancements: Modern technology using the VoIP will be transitioned into County facilities to provide unified messaging, integrated voice, email and instant messaging communication on a robust, scalable platform.
- B.02.5 Ensure a solution with network redundancy.
- B.02.6 Maintain existing telephone numbers and extensions.
- B.02.7 Consolidate Voice Mail and implement Unified Messaging. Maintain existing auto-attendant messages and process (not physical system).
- B.02.8 Replace or interface with existing paging and intercom systems.
- B.02.9 Review present and future expansion and technology needs.
- B.02.10 Adhere to all public safety communication requirements, i.e. PS/ALI (Private Switch/Automatic Location Identification).

B.03 PHASE 1 – EXISTING SYSTEM REVIEW AND ANALYSIS

- B.03.1 The successful Proposer shall review existing telephone, data communication, infrastructure and ancillary equipment and systems; and determine the feasibility of connecting telephone services via County-owned fiber network into the new system. The successful Proposer shall interview key system users to develop an appropriate recommendation.
- B.03.2 The successful Proposer shall explore what, if any, of the current equipment is capable of being reused and upgraded to accommodate the new and recommended platforms.
- B.03.3 The successful Proposer shall take into consideration industry trends as to direction of telecommunication and data communication in its recommendation.

- B.03.4 The successful Proposer shall present findings and make a written report to the County of equipment required to implement a completely new County-wide solution as designated.
 - This comprehensive report shall detail the recommendation (of more than one option) for the County's telecommunication and data systems, including cost estimates for each recommended type of system.
- B.03.5 The successful Proposer shall provide a cost analysis to implement the improvements. The cost analysis should include consideration of a phased implementation approach and projected costs for annual operation and maintenance.
- B.03.6 The successful Proposer shall make recommendations (budgetary and design) in order to include all existing services and approved enhancements.
- B.03.7 For use in obtaining competitive bids, the successful Proposer shall provide a complete bidding document that includes written technical specifications (MSWORD format) for the approved systems, itemized cost items, installation procedures, etc.
- B.03.8 The County shall review the successful Proposer Phase 1 work and provide the successful Proposer with written notice to proceed on Phase 2. If the County does not provide the successful Proposer with written notice to proceed, the agreement may terminate after Phase 1.
- B.03.9 The County shall be the owner of all end product deliverables and data accumulated by the successful Proposer. The County will have the right to use the successful Proposer's Phase 1 deliverables for work with any other vendors.

B.04 PHASE 2 – RECOMMENDATION OF SYSTEM(S)

- B.04.1 After receiving notice to proceed on Phase 2, the successful Proposer shall use the findings in Phase 1, to recommend vendors and products which meet the County's specifications.
- B.04.2 The successful Proposer shall coordinate demonstrations of the potential systems including equipment, services and administration.
- B.04.3 The successful Proposer shall draft a telecommunications equipment contracts for acquisition, implementation, and maintenance for review and acceptance.

- B.04.5 The successful Proposer shall develop an implementation plan and schedule that identifies the County's resources required, including ancillary data communication equipment, new cable, training schedule and requirements for transition to new system.
- B.04.6 The successful Proposer shall report on potential cost savings including monthly circuits, equipment leasing, maintenance and energy.
- B.04.7 The County will review the successful Proposer's Phase 2 work and provide the successful Proposer with written notice to proceed on Phase 3. If the County does not provide the successful Proposer with written notice to proceed, the agreement may terminate after Phase 2.
- B.04.8 The County will be the owner of all end product deliverables and data accumulated by the successful Proposer. The County will have the right to use the successful Proposer's Phase 2 deliverables for work with any other vendors.

B.05 PHASE 3 – INSTALLATION, IMPLEMENTATION, AND TRAINING

- B.05.1 After the County approves the procurement of telephone equipment, the successful Proposer shall manage the installation, implementation, and training of the chosen system.
- B.05.2 The successful Proposer shall ensure that there are no service disruptions of the Police or Fire non-emergency lines in executing transition to new system.
- B.05.3 The successful Proposer shall assist the County's non-emergency operating departments to ensure no service disruptions during operating hours in executing transition to new system.
- B.05.4 The successful Proposer shall coordinate with equipment installers to minimize office operation disruptions.
- B.05.5 The successful Proposer shall conduct an acceptance test to validate that the system meets the contract specifications and that all components specified in the successful contractor's proposal have been installed.
- B.05.6 The successful Proposer shall coordinate training and provide end-user documents for operating departments.
- B.05.7 The successful Proposer shall coordinate administration training and provide administration and system documents for Information Technology department.

B.06 PHASE 4 - REMOVAL AND PROPER DISPOSAL OF OLD EQUIPMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF NEW SYSTEM

- B.06.1 The successful Proposer shall coordinate the removal and proper disposal of all old equipment after the County has formally accepted the new system.
- B.06.2 Warranty period and maintenance information shall be submitted for the first year after system acceptance. Include a statement regarding the manufacturer's plans for the proposed system design, (e.g., any enhancements or obsolescence being considered in the near future). Will the manufacturer support the proposed software for the life of the system?

B.07 OWNERSHIP OF DELIVERABLES

B.07.1 The County will be the owner of all end product deliverables. The County will have the right to use the vendor's deliverables with any other vendor.

B.08 PHASED WORK

B.08.1 The work shall be done in phases. The County will have the right to terminate the services after each phase. The County will have the right to select a different vendor for each phase of the work and to complete the project using multiple vendors.

SECTION C: FORM OF PROPOSAL

This section identifies specific information which must be contained within each proposal. The contents of each proposal shall be <u>separated</u> and <u>arranged with tabs</u> in the same order as listed in <u>Sections C.01, through C.04</u>, identifying the response to each specific item.

The information that you provide shall be used to determine those Proposers with perceived ability to perform the Scope of Services as stated in this Request for Proposal which may overall best meet the needs of Manatee County. A review with those Proposers reasonably susceptible of being selected for award may be conducted for the purposes of clarification of both ability and benefit to Manatee County. See Section D Selection.

C.01 MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS TO BE CONSIDERED:

To qualify for any consideration, the Proposer(s) must present proof of any licensing or certification which will be required by law to perform the services set out in the scope of services required in this RFP.

Proposals may be presented by a single business entity, a joint venture, or partnership.

Prior to any consideration of the responses to the criteria in this Request for Proposals, Proposers are to document in their Proposals they have the following experience:

MINIMUM EXPERIENCE TO BE CONSIDERED:

Proposers shall have substantial and verifiable experience in the performing or overseeing the performance of four (4) similar projects specifying a telephony system upgrade consultation which were each sized in excess of a one thousand (1000) port (or user) system.

In the event more than one entity is joining in making this proposal, each entity shall set forth its respective experience and qualifications for those areas the entity intends to perform.

<u>If subcontractors are to be used in your proposal</u>, detail the business entities, description of the service provided, and responses in the same level of detail and tabbed order as instructed in this Request for Proposal for the Proposer.

For each of the Proposer(s)' relevant past performance of similar projects and to validate experience, expertise and capabilities, Proposers shall provide the following details:

- a. Name and location of the Client and the project, the year of performance and the date the project was fully operational and accepted. The specific details of the project including the components and subcontractors utilized. Specify the name, title and telephone number for the Clients contract manager for the project; and
- b. Provide the names of your firm's staff and their direct involvement in the project.
- c. The name and telephone numbers of the persons representing the individual agencies with which the identified key staff directly worked; and
- d. Governmental agency, if any, which verified compliance with its requirements or standards, and the names and telephone numbers of the key persons with direct knowledge of this process to achieve compliance.

After Manatee County staff validates the Minimum Qualifications have been met, those Proposals found to be in compliance will be considered by the screening committee.

D.01 EVALUATION FACTORS

Evaluation of proposals will be conducted by an evaluation committee. The committee's goal will be to identify the proposal which will overall best meet the needs of Manatee County as determined from the proposals received and subsequent investigation by the County. Evaluation factors are price and demonstrated ability of the Proposer(s) to perform the Scope of Services as generally outlined in Section B of this Request for Proposal in the most timely and efficient manner and the proposal(s) which will provide the best solution to meet the needs of Manatee county as determined from the responses to this Request for Proposal and subsequent investigation.

D.02 RELATIVE IMPORTANCE OF EVALUATION FACTORS

Unless noted, no weight will be assigned to the Evaluation Factors stated above.

D.03 PRELIMINARY RANKING

An evaluation committee shall determine from the responses to this Request for Proposals and subsequent investigation as necessary, the Proposer(s) most qualified to be selected to negotiate an agreement.

D.04 REVIEW OF PROPOSERS AND PROPOSALS

In-person reviews may be conducted with responsible Proposers who are deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award, for the purposes of assuring full understanding of: (a) conformance to the solicitation requirements, (b) the abilities of the Proposer, and (c) the proposal submitted.

Proposers shall be available for presentations to and interviews with the screening committee, upon reasonable notification from the Purchasing Division. The date(s) and time(s) of any such presentations / interviews shall be determined solely by the County, and may be closed to the public in the discretion of the Purchasing Official, and to the extent permitted by law.

D.05 SELECTION FOR NEGOTIATION

The evaluation committee will make a recommendation to the County Administrator as to the proposer the County should enter negotiations with. The County Administrator will act upon that recommendation and, if accepted, the successful Proposer(s) will be invited to enter negotiations led by the Purchasing Division.

D.06 AWARD

Award of an agreement is subject to the successful negotiations and the approval of either the County Administrator or the Board of County Commissioners (as provided for in the current Purchasing Code and Procurement Procedures).

SECTION E: NEGOTIATION OF THE AGREEMENT

E.01 GENERAL

The following general terms and conditions apply to the proposal submitted for consideration and the subsequent negotiations:

- a. The proposal will serve as a basis for negotiating an agreement, but not compel adherence to its terms or conditions.
- b. Upon submission, all proposals become the property of the County which has the right to use any or all ideas presented in any proposal submitted in response to this Request for Proposal whether or not the proposal is accepted.
- c. All products and papers produced in the course of this engagement become the property of the County upon termination or completion of the engagement.

E.02 AGREEMENT

The selected Proposer(s) shall be required to negotiate an agreement, in a form and with provisions acceptable to Manatee County.

The negotiated Agreement may or may not include all elements of this RFP or the resulting successful proposal where alternative terms or conditions become more desirable to the County, and the parties agree to such terms.

The parties will negotiate the term of the agreement, and the circumstances in which it may be renewed, assigned or terminated.

The parties will negotiate matters of insurance, liability, record-keeping, auditing, and all other relevant contractual matters.

You will note that Manatee County collaborates with the Manatee Chamber of Commerce, posting bids on www.manateechamber.com as well as using the same vendor categories for registration. Our staff can assist you with your registration as needed. Our office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday on regular business days. MANATEE COUNTY LOCAL PREFERENCE LAW AND VENDOR REGISTRATION

Section 2-26-6. Local preference, tie bids, <u>local business defined.</u>

- (a) Whenever a responsible local business bidder and a responsible non-local business bidder are found, upon the opening of bids, to have both submitted the lowest responsive bid, the bid of the local bidder shall be awarded the contract. Should more than one responsible local business bidder match the responsible non-local business bidder's lowest responsive bid, or should no responsible local business bidder match the lowest responsive bid but two or more responsible non-local business bidders submit lowest responsive bids for equal amounts, then the award of the contract shall be determined by a chance drawing, coin toss, or similar tie-breaking method conducted by the purchasing office and open to the public. Any bidders seeking to be recognized as local businesses for purposes of this local business preference provision may be required by the terms of the bid announcement to certify they meet the definition of local business set forth in this section, and to register as a local business with the county in the manner prescribed by the county to facilitate the county's ability to track the award of contracts to local businesses and to allow the county to provide future notifications to its local businesses concerning other bidding opportunities.
- (b) Nothing herein shall be deemed to prohibit the inclusion of requirements with respect to operating and maintaining a local place of business in any invitation for bids when the bidder's location materially affects the provisions of the services or supplies that are required by the invitation.
- (c) Local business is defined as a business legally authorized to engage in the sale of the goods and/or services to be procured, and which certifies within its bid that for at least six (6) months prior to the announcement of the solicitation of bids it has maintained a physical place of business in Manatee, Desoto, Hardee, Hillsborough, Pinellas or Sarasota County with at least one full-time employees at that location.
- (d) Each solicitation for bids made by the county shall contain terms expressly describing the local business preference policies of the county, and shall provide that by electing to submit a bid pursuant to a request for bids, all bidders are deemed to understand and agree to those policies.
- (e) For all contracts for architecture, professional engineering, or other professional services governed by Florida Statute § 287.055, the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act, the county shall include the local business status of a firm among the factors considered when selecting which firms are "most highly qualified." In determining which firm is the "most qualified" for purposes of negotiating a satisfactory contract, preference shall be given to a local business where all other relevant factors are equal.
- (f) Local preference shall not apply to the following categories of contracts:
 - 1. Goods or services provided under a cooperative purchasing agreement or similar "piggyback" contract;
 - 2. Contracts for professional services subject to Florida Statute § 287.055, the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act, except as provided for in subsection (e) above;

Section 2-26-6. Local preference, (CONTINUED)

- (f) Local preference shall not apply to the following categories of contracts continued)
 - 3. Purchases or contracts which are funded, in whole or in part, by a governmental or other funding entity, where the terms and conditions of receipt of the funds prohibit the preference;
 - 4. Purchases or contracts made pursuant to a non-competitive award process, unless otherwise provided by this section;
 - 5. Any bid announcement which specifically provides that the general local preference policies set forth in this section are suspended due to the unique nature of the goods or services sought, the existence of an emergency as found by either the county commission or county administrator, or where such suspension is, in the opinion of the county attorney, required by law.
 - (g) To qualify for local preference under this section, a local business must certify to the County that it:
 - 1. Has not within the five years prior to the bid announcement admitted guilt or been found guilty by any court or state or federal regulatory enforcement agency of violation of any criminal law, or a law or administrative regulation regarding fraud;
 - 2. Is not currently subject to an unresolved citation or notice of violation of any Manatee County Code provision, except citations or notices which are the subject of a current legal appeal, as of the date of the bid announcement:
 - 3. Is not delinquent in the payment of any fines, liens, assessments, fees or taxes to any governmental unit or taxing authority within Manatee County, except any such sums which are the subject of a current legal appeal.
