RFP No. 20-R074548BLS is amended as set forth herein. Responses to questions posed by prospective bidders are provided below. This addendum is hereby incorporated in and made a part of RFP No. 20-R74548BLS.

The deadline to submit all inquiries concerning interpretation, clarification, or additional information pertaining to this RFP was October 14, 2020 at 3:00 P.M. ET.

QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES:

- Q1. Do you anticipate extending the bid due date?**
R1. No.
- Q2. What additional details are you willing to provide, if any, beyond what is stated in bid documents concerning how you will identify the winning bid?**
R2. Refer to Section B, Evaluation of Proposals.
- Q3. Was this bid posted to the nationwide free bid notification website at www.mygovwatch.com/free?**
R3. No.
- Q4. Other than your own website, where was this bid posted?**
R4. This proposal was solicited on BidSync, MyManatee.org and through direct solicitation.
- Q5. Is there past pricing or bid tabulation available?**
R5. Previous pricing attached.

Q6. Exhibit 2, 2.02, C, 3 states Proposer must employ or subcontract with a minimum of two individuals who possess current valid CDL license with HAZMAT endorsement for transport of hazardous materials issued by the Florida Department of Highway Safety of Motor Vehicles? Would the County accept CDL's with HAZMAT endorsement from other states?

R6. No, the County cannot accept per the following from FDOT:

“We **will** reciprocate an **out of state** or a Canadian commercial driver **license**. However, an **out of state** applicant with a **hazmat endorsement will** have to reapply for a **hazmat endorsement**, which **will** include background check, appropriate exams and fees.”

Q7. Page 4 states, 1 Original (bound) and (1) Electronic format, but on page 62, it states, 1 Original (bound), 2 copies (bound) and 1 electronic format. Which is correct?

R7. One (1) bound original clearly identifying Proposer and marked “ORIGINAL”.
One (1) electronic format copy clearly identifying Proposer.

Q8. Please explain specifically how the pricing of one proposal will be evaluated against the pricing from another proposal, including the answer to these questions:

- a) Will each pricing proposal be analyzed and refined to become one total number which can then be compared to the other proposals?
- b) Will all pricing line items be evaluated equally or will some line items receive more importance in the evaluation?

R8. Refer to Section C, Negotiation of the Agreement.

Q9. Could you please provide the bid tabulation from the previous bidding cycle?

R9. Refer to R5.

Q10. Since Manatee County leaves the option open to extend the contract for an additional five year, can the Contractor negotiate a consumer price index increase?

R10. Refer to Section C, Negotiation of the Agreement.

Q11. How many hardcopy/printed versions of the proposal are required?

R11. One (1) bound original clearly identifying Proposer and marked “ORIGINAL”.

Q12. In regard to hazardous trees, stumps and limbs, Exhibit 3, Fee Schedule states that these line items should include “disposal”. Does that specifically mean removal, including transport, reduction and final disposal? Typically, these debris items are removed and placed on the ROW (right of way) for transport with other vegetative storm-related debris, and quantified as such. If the disposal is separated, it would have to be a separate item for each debris items from removal throughout final disposal. Would the County consider changing the scope to read “removal of item and placement on the public ROW to be addressed under line item 2?

R12. Fees should include “disposal” and removal shall be as stated in solicitation.

- Q13. Exhibit 3, Fee Schedule, line item 17, what does the blank for “each” represent?**
R13. Each stump.
- Q14. Exhibit 3, Fee Schedule, line item 32, 33 and 34, what unit of measure rate is the County requesting (hourly, cubic yard, ton, etc.)?**
R14. Unit of measure shall be per household or commercial pick up as stated.
- Q15. Exhibit 3, Fee Schedule, line item 13 and 15, the scope of work states that the contractor is to include hauling of tree debris resulting from the leaner and hanger removals to the DMS as part of the tree and limb removal unit rate. This would require collection trucks to follow the tree removal crews and ONLY pick up debris from their work, thereby skipping existing piles of debris and leaving it on the street to be picked up by a separate collection truck. If there is a major event, collection trucks will be efficiently used if they could travel the ROW and pick up ALL debris rather than skipping piles while only following the tree crew. This also means that all resulting debris will have to be staged separately at the DMS to ensure no comingling of debris is allowed. There will be a need for additional equipment to manage the site segregated for hazardous tree work or there will be lost time in moving equipment between the two areas. Limited Debris Management Sites, their size and locations often make this scenario extremely difficult. The typical method is to price hazardous trees and hanging limbs as a “cut only” rate and to place the resulting debris in the ROW for collection as vegetative debris. This method frees up collection trucks and expedites the collection process. Will the County consider changing the scope to allow for the debris from removing hazardous leaning trees and hanging limbs to be placed in the ROW to be collected and paid for as regular vegetative debris?**
R15. No.
- Q16. Exhibit 3, Fee Schedule, line items 10 and 11 – Hazardous material is typically price per pound. Would the County consider changing the unit of measure to be price per pound, rather than per 55-gallon container?**
R16. No.
- Q17. What is the contract length?**
R17. Reference Section C, Negotiation of the Agreement.
- Q18. Is the Fee Proposal to be included on the USB in addition to the Proposal?**
R18. Yes.
- Q19. Would the County please clarify if the request for proposal is seeking vendors for debris hauling services or for debris monitoring services? If both services are requested, can the County please provide additional scope addressing the County’s monitoring needs?**
R19: The County is seeking proposals from individuals, corporations, partnerships, and other legal entities authorized to do business in the State of Florida (Proposers), to

provide Debris Management Services and Emergency Response Management and Recovery Services. Refer to Exhibit 1, Scope of Services.

Q20. It is understood that the County shall negotiate in good faith the terms and conditions and agreement with the awarded Proposer.

Please confirm that the proposer shall provide its exceptions or redlines to the County at the award phase and not the proposal submission phase?

R20. Refer to Section C, Negotiation of the Agreement.

Q21. Some of the insurance coverage being requested does not seem to apply to the Scope of Work being requested. Will the county consider removing all those requirements that do not apply to the scope of work?

R21. No.

Q22. We typically do not see a requirement for retainage for this type of service, would the County consider removing this requirement from the agreement?

If applicable, please provide the number of days upon which the retainage will be returned to the proposer after the final reconciliation has been completed?

R22. This will stay in place to make sure work and damage repairs are completed and all subcontractors are paid.

This would be conditional based on the “In order to recover the retainage, the Contractor must successfully complete and receive a letter of completion from the County, for all work zones. Retainage will be held until final reconciliation is complete. Portions of the retainage may be held by the County to repair damages caused by the Contractor to public or private property”.

Q23. Some of the payment terms seem to be geared toward hauling contractors, and not for monitoring operations that will be provided under this agreement. Will the County provide payment terms that are geared toward this type of monitoring services being provided?

R23. Refer to R1.

Q24. Is the County open to removing all those payment terms that do not apply to debris monitoring services?

R24. Refer to R1.

Q25. We typically do not see a requirement for waiver and release forms, would the County consider removing this requirement from the agreement?

R25. This will stay in place to make sure work and damage repairs are completed and all subcontractors are paid.

Q26. The price sheet provided seems to be in line with hauling services, not monitoring, please confirm that pricing shall be in accordance with procurement guidance for recipients and subrecipients under 2 c.f.r part 200 (uniform rules) supplement to the public assistance procurement disaster assistance team (pdatt) field manual FEMA does not reimburse DAC based on blended rates (e.g., a labor rate plus a percentage of overall travel expenses or one rate for all levels of employees involved in a project). Labor and travel expenses must be tracked separately and shown as directly related to a specific project?

R26. Refer to Section C, Negotiation of the Agreement.

Q27. The resulting agreement will be extended for use by other public agencies. The awarded proposer will need to be able to extend the fixed fee pricing and services to other public agencies.

In the event that multiple agencies request to utilize the agreement at the same time, would the proposer be allowed to review the requests and accept the use of the agreement by other public agencies after proposer has confirmed that it is available to provide the services being requested.

R27. This is at the discretion of the awarded Proposer(s).

No additional questions will be considered after the issuance of this Addendum No. 1.
