BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

Manatee County Procurement Division has completed a due diligence review and intends to procure Annual Fireline Backflow Services & Testing from Total Fire Protection, Inc. without conducting a competitive solicitation process for the following reason(s):

The Manatee County Utilities Department, Water Compliance Division requires continuous servicing and testing of fireline backflows. Compliance demands annual servicing and testing, especially for those with noncompliant fireline prevention assemblies, with reports to be submitted as per Article X of Chapter 2-31, Manatee County Code of Ordinances and Resolution R-13-194. In alignment with the Safe Drinking Water Act, F.A.C. 62.550 and 62.555, and AWWA Manual M-14, testing the fireline backflow preventers is crucial to safeguard the public drinking water supply from inadvertent contamination. With internal seals, springs, and moving parts that can deteriorate over time, it's imperative to conduct periodic testing to ensure proper functionality in protecting the Manatee County drinking water supply. Despite the unsuccessful ITQ in April 2025, in response to maintaining clean water for the county's residents, engaging with a contractor like Total Fire Protection, Inc. promptly is essential to avert any potential setbacks.
