Dear Mr. Benitez:

This letter includes Carollo Engineers' responses to questions submitted by prospective bidders.

1. Clarify Question/Answer 1 on Addendum 1.

RAS Pump No. 2 is existing but NO existing VFD.

2. Per S-02 Section B, this detail calls for the launder slab to be thickness of 1'-4". Please confirm this thickness is uniform for the entire circumference of the tank. If this thickness is the same, please also confirm the thickness of the launder drop box is 1'-0" (see sections A and C on S-02).

The 1'-4" launder slab thickness is as shown in Section-1 of Section-B on Drawing S-02. This 1'-4" slab thickness is only in the area of the scum pipe penetration. The remaining launder slab thickness is 1'-0".

3. Per D-01, note 5, states to remove the existing walkway, stairs, and light poles. This is not required for the installation work for the equipment or concrete. Please advise if it is acceptable to not remove and protect only

Bidders shall complete the demolition according to all requirements on Drawing D-01.

4. Please provide a copy of the Lead & Asbestos Surveys for both Clarifiers so we determine how to estimate the demolition activities

No lead paint or asbestos surveys were completed.
