 The initial meeting of the Evaluation Committee convened on 3/25/2013. After considerable discussion it was determined that six (6) of the thirteen (13) proposers should provide oral interviews.

Those firms, in alphabetical order, were:

Bentley Architects & Engineers - Longwood Fawley/Bryant - Bradenton Gould Evans / RNL - Tampa Harvard /Jolly - Sarasota JNZ-POND - Bradenton

• The Evaluation Committee convened on April 17, 2013 and April 18, 2013 for the Oral Presentations from each selected firm.

The Evaluation Committee convened on April 29, 2013 for the purpose of considering the six (6) short listed firms. The Committee members discussed each firm and the value each may potentially bring to this project. The open discussion concluded prompting the Chairman to ask the voting members if they were prepared to vote for the firm that would receive our recommendation for entering into negotiation. The voting members cast their vote unanimously selecting the firm of JNZ – POND, a joint venture, to provide the services required by the Request for Proposal.

JNZ-POND, a joint venture in the State of Florida and the top ranked firm, is deemed the most qualified team to provide design and construction administration services for the Fleet Transit Facility. The JNZ-POND Joint Venture was created by bringing together two experienced firms, Jerry Zoller Architect/Planner AIA, PA of Bradenton and POND and Associates of Jacksonville. Jerry Zoller, Architect/Planner, brings the required architectural and planning elements to this project while POND and Associates will provide the project management experience and a design compliance project manager which will be required from groundbreaking to Certificate of Occupancy and will also assist in the FTA oversight monitoring.

The JNZ-POND project manager is familiar with the joint venture team members and their roles and also displayed a complete understanding of the detailed, multiple disciplines, multitasking elements and also the deadline and budget driven focus which are all critical to the tight schedule and limited budget. This team offered the most detail and through answering all questions and demonstrated experience with local, large and federal government projects such as the North Fulton Maintenance and Operations Center, in Alpharetta, GA, a 107,000 square foot facility on 35 acres at a cost of \$20,100,000. The knowledge of the FTA design requirements is a top priority for this project. JNZ-POND has engaged a nationally recognized expert in FTA design compliance, Maintenance Design Group (MDG) of Baltimore Maryland, to assure that the final design and layout meets all FTA Regulations. This firm ensures compliance with the FTA Best Practices Manual and brings expertise in programming of facility needs and assessment and assistance in construction administration. This firm has worked on multiple projects across the United States such as the Los Angeles Metro Division 13 Bus Maintenance Facility, a 114,000 square foot facility with a 440,000 square foot parking garage at an estimated project cost of \$80,000,000.00. This Joint Venture brings a team well suited to perform on this project through careful sub-consultant selection of and a focus on bringing value to our Fleet Facility project. Those sub-consultants are:

ZNS Engineering, Bradenton – Providing Civil, Survey and Landscaping.

Stewart Engineering, Sarasota – Providing mechanical, electrical, plumbing and fire protection design.

Eco Consultants, Palmetto – Providing Environmental Engineering.

Siebein Associates, Gainesville - Providing Acoustical Engineering

Qualified Systems Contracting, Gainesville – Providing security and safety systems design

Tindale – Oliver & Associates, Tampa – Providing traffic engineering

Base Consultants, Orlando - Providing structural engineering

Maintenance Design Group (MDG), Baltimore MD – Providing facility design/layout review and FTA compliance

Ardaman and Associates, Sarasota – providing geotechnical services KCC Estimating and Construction Services – providing cost estimating

The JNZ-POND team provides continuously monitored project management with checks and balances in place for quality and document control which begins on day one.

Harvard Jolly, Inc. the second ranked firm, is well respected in the State of Florida with 75 Years of experience in their field. This firm presented an excellent and well thought out team and their presentation was well received by the Committee. They answered all questions adequately and appear to be capable of completing the project. Their strengths were the architectural team and the industry knowledge of their proposed sub-consultant, Jacobs Engineering of Tampa, who brings Transit specific experience. This team, however, did not demonstrate strong qualifications for all required disciplines.

Bentley Architects & Engineers, the third ranked firm, provided an excellent and informational Oral Presentation with a good mix of team members. They presented a very methodological approach to the project with specific milestones and cost controls during construction. They also presented a well laid out mechanical, electrical and plumbing approach and a strong project manager. All questions were answered adequately. Bentley brings an industry expert to the team by partnering with Maintenance Design Group (MDG) to help with the facility design/layout. Bentley Architects & Engineer, although qualified, did not demonstrate they had the depth and breadth of knowledge on their team that was desired by Manatee County and present with the other proposers.

The remaining presenting firms, Fawley/Bryant, Gould Evans / RNL, and Schenkel & Shultz, are all well respected and talented firms within the professional service community; however, they did not present to be as well qualified in comparison to the top ranked firms.

 These remaining respondents, although well qualified, were not selected based on a comparison of capabilities of the selected firms.
