BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

- The Scope of Service is contingent upon the availability of funds from the West Central Florida Area Agency on Aging, Inc., the Manatee County Board Commissioners, as County Lead Agency for Community Care for the Elderly Program (CCE) which calls for the Personal Care Service to assist the functionally impaired elderly person with bathing, dressing and ambulation for a specified period of time and to:
 - Maintain an elderly persons safety while bathing, grooming and/or toileting.
 - Ensure elderly persons have a clean body and hair on a regular basis.
 - Prevent inappropriate institutionalization of functionally impaired elderly persons.

- The Evaluation Committee convened on 6/5/2013 and determined that four (4) proposers should be selected for negotiations Those firms, in alphabetical order, were:
- All Stat Home Health – Sarasota
Home Instead Senior Care – Bradenton
Southern Home Care Services dba ResCare Home Care - Bradenton
Tidewell Home Health, LLC dba Approved Home Health – Bradenton

The four (4) firms selected have all the capabilities, resources, and experience required by the County and are staffed with professionals all of whom have the skills and expertise to adequately and successfully serve the Elderly as they provide the services required by the scope of services.

The remaining respondents listed below, although well qualified, were not selected based on a comparison of capabilities of the selected firms.

A Life At Home - Bradenton
Right Care Services (Loyalty Home Care) - Tampa
Utopia Home Care, Inc – Tampa
