# SECTION A INFORMATION TO BIDDERS

#### A.01 OPENING LOCATION

Sealed bids will be <u>publicly opened</u> at the <u>Manatee County Purchasing Division</u>, <u>1112 Manatee Avenue West</u>, <u>Suite 803</u>, <u>Bradenton</u>, <u>Florida 34205</u> in the presence of County officials at the time and date stated, or soon thereafter. All bidders or their representatives are invited to attend the sealed bid opening.

Any bids received after the stated time and date will not be considered. It shall be the sole responsibility of the bidder to have their bid <u>delivered to the Manatee County Purchasing Division</u> for receipt on or before the stated time and date. Bidder shall be solely and strictly responsible for its timely delivery to the Purchasing Division. Bids delayed by mail, courier, or bids delayed for any other reason, shall not be considered, shall not be opened at the public opening, and arrangements shall be made for their return at the bidder's request and expense.

#### A.02 SEALED & MARKED

Bids shall be submitted in duplicate, <u>one original (marked Original) and one copy/copies (marked Copy)</u> of your <u>signed bid</u> shall be submitted in one <u>sealed package</u>, clearly marked on the outside "<u>Sealed Bid #16-1803CB</u>, <u>Pump Repair & Machine Work</u>" along with your company name.

For your convenience, a mailing label is provided with this Invitation for Bid or you may address the package as follows:

All blank spaces on the bid form must be filled in as noted with amounts extended and totaled and no modifications shall be made in the wording of the forms or in the items thereupon. In the event an edit is made in your submittal, the bidder shall write its initials by the change. Any bid may be rejected which contains any omissions, alterations, irregularities of any kind, or which in any manner fail to conform to the requirements of this IFB.

A bid made by an individual, either in his/her own or proper person or under a trade or firm name, shall be executed under the individual's signature. If made by a partnership, the bid shall be executed by two or more of the general partners. If made by a corporation, the bid shall be executed by its President or other legally authorized corporate officer or agent.

#### A.03 BID FORMS

Bids must be submitted on the provided forms, although additional pages may be attached. Bidders must fully complete all pages of the Bid Forms. Bid Forms must be executed by an authorized signatory who has the legal authority to make the bid and bind the company. Bidders must fully comply with all requirements of this IFB in its entirety. Failure to comply shall result in bidder being deemed nonresponsive.

#### A.04 MATHEMATICAL ERRORS

Bid Forms without imbedded mathematical formulas:

In the event of multiplication/extension error(s), the unit price shall prevail. In the event of addition error(s) the extension totals will prevail. In the event the dollar amount for contract contingency is omitted, it will be added to the total price of the bid.

Bid Forms with imbedded mathematical formulas:

Interactive Bid Forms that contain mathematical formulas may be used for automating lengthy and complex bid forms. In the event these forms are used and a multiplication/extension error(s) is discovered, the unit price entered by the vendor shall prevail. The vendor shall assume the responsibility and accuracy of the information input in the bid form and therefore shall verify that the calculations are correct before submitting their bid.

Regardless of which type of bid form is used, all bids shall be reviewed mathematically and corrected by the Purchasing Division, if necessary, using these standards, prior to additional evaluation.

#### A.05 SECURING BID DOCUMENTS

IFB's and all documents issued pursuant to the IFB are available for download at no charge at mymanatee.org by clicking on "Bids and Proposals" on the left side of the home page. You may view and print these pdf files using Adobe Reader software.

Manatee County may also use DemandStar to distribute bids. Visit the DemandStar website at <a href="www.Demandstar.com">www.Demandstar.com</a> for more information regarding this service. Participation in the DemandStar system is not a requirement for doing business with Manatee County.

Complete copies of the IFB and all related documents are available for public inspection at the Manatee County Purchasing Division, 1112 Manatee Avenue West, Suite 803, Bradenton, FL 34205, or by calling (941) 749-3014. Appointments are encouraged. Documents are available between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM Monday through Friday, with the exception of holidays.

In addition, Manatee County informs the Manatee Chamber of Commerce of all active solicitations who then distributes the information to their members.

#### A.06 EXAMINATION OF BID DOCUMENTS AND SITE(S)

It is the responsibility of each bidder before submitting a bid to (a) examine all IFB documents thoroughly; (b) consider federal, state, and local codes, laws, and regulations which may affect costs, progress, performance, or furnishing of the work; (c) study and carefully correlate bidder's observations with the IFB documents; and (d) notify the County of all conflicts, errors, or discrepancies in the IFB documents prior to the deadline for clarification requests.

#### A.07 NON-EXCLUSIVE

Unless otherwise stated in this bid specification, any contracts resulting from this bid are nonexclusive. The County reserves the right, in its sole opinion, to purchase items listed in this bid through the State of Florida contracts, cooperatives, other current government contracts, and nonprofit contracts as provided in the Manatee County Purchasing Policy. The County reserves the rights to solicit separate bids for requirements that are a portion of a larger contract bid as a whole. Additionally at the County's sole option, additional contracts may be entered into as a result of such situations as unusual volumes, time/delivery requirements, special requirements, other brands, lease, project specific requirements, or similar situations.

#### A.08 MODIFICATION OF BID DOCUMENTS

If a bidder wishes to recommend changes to any portion of the IFB documents, the bidder shall furnish, in writing, data and information necessary to aid County in evaluating the request to modify the IFB documents. County is not obligated to make any changes to the IFB documents. Unless an addendum is issued, the IFB documents shall remain unaltered.

#### A.09 CLARIFICATION REQUESTS & ADDENDA

Each bidder shall examine all IFB documents and shall judge all matters relating to their adequacy and accuracy. Any inquiries, suggestions or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to this IFB shall be made through the Manatee County Purchasing Division. County shall not be responsible for oral interpretations given by any County employee, representative, or others.

10:00 AM on June 16, 2016 shall be the deadline to submit to the Purchasing Division, in writing, all inquiries, suggestions, or requests concerning interpretation, clarification or additional information pertaining to this IFB.

This deadline has been established to maintain fair treatment of all potential bidders, while maintaining progression of the work.

If any addenda are issued to this IFB, County will post the documents on the Purchasing Division's web page at <a href="http://www.mymanatee.org/purchasing">http://www.mymanatee.org/purchasing</a>, and then by clicking on "Bids and Proposals". If the original solicitation was broadcast via DemandStar, the addenda will also be broadcast on the DemandStar distribution system to "Planholders" on this web service.

The issuance of a written addendum is the only official method whereby interpretation, clarification or additional information can be given.

It shall be the <u>responsibility of each bidder, prior to submitting a bid</u>, to contact the Purchasing Division (see contact information on the cover page) to <u>determine if any addenda were issued</u> and to make such addenda a part of their bid.

A complete set of the IFB documents must be used in preparing bids. County assumes no responsibility for errors and misinterpretations resulting from the use of incomplete sets of bid documents.

#### A.10 CONFIDENTIALITY OF SECURITY RELATED RECORDS

- (a) Pursuant to Florida Statutes § 119.071(3), the following records (hereinafter referred to collectively as "the Confidential Security Records") are confidential and exempt from the disclosure requirements of Florida Statutes § 119.07(1):
  - 1. A Security System Plan or portion thereof for any property owned by or leased to the County or any privately owned or leased property held by the County.
  - 2. Building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, which depict the internal layout and structural elements of a building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or other structure owned or operated by the County.
  - 3. Building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, which depict the internal layout or structural elements of an attractions and recreation facility, entertainment or resort complex, industrial complex, retail and service development, office development, or hotel or motel development in the possession of, submitted to the County.
- (b) Contractor/Vendor agrees that it shall not, as a result of a public records request or for any other reason disclose the contents of, or release or provide copies of the Confidential Security Records to any other party absent the express written authorization of the County's Property Management Director or to comply with a court order requiring such release or disclosure. To the extent Contractor/Vendor receives a request for such records, it shall immediately contact the County's designated Contract Manager who shall coordinate the County's response to the request. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Contractor/Vendor may
  - 1. Disclose or release Security System Plans to:
    - (A) The property owner or leaseholder; or
    - (B) Another state or federal agency to prevent, detect, guard against, respond to, investigate, or manage the consequences of any attempted or actual act of terrorism, or to prosecute those persons who are responsible for such attempts or acts.

- 2. Disclose or release building plans, blueprints, schematic drawings, and diagrams, including draft, preliminary, and final formats, which depict the internal layout and structural elements of a building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or other structure owned or operated by the County:
  - (A) To another governmental entity if disclosure is necessary for the receiving entity to perform its duties and responsibilities;
  - (B) To a licensed architect, engineer, or contractor who is performing work on or related to the building, arena, stadium, water treatment facility, or other structure owned or operated by the County and is contractually bound by the Contractor/Vendor to comply with this Article/Section; or
  - (C) Upon a showing of good cause before a court of competent jurisdiction.
- (c) For purposes of this Article/Section, the term "Security System Plan" includes all:
  - 1. Records, information, photographs, audio and visual presentations, schematic diagrams, surveys, recommendations, or consultations or portions thereof relating directly to the physical security of the facility or revealing security systems;
  - 2. Threat assessments conducted by any agency or any private entity;
  - 3. Threat response plans;
  - 4. Emergency evacuation plans;
  - 5. Sheltering arrangements; or
  - 6. Manuals for security personnel, emergency equipment, or security training.

#### A.11 LOBBYING

After the issuance of any IFB, prospective bidders or their agents, representatives or persons acting at the request of such bidder shall not contact, communicate with or discuss any matter relating to the IFB with any officer, agent or employee of Manatee County other than the Purchasing Official or the contact identified on the first page of this IFB, pursuant to the Manatee County Code of Laws. This prohibition includes copying such persons on all written communication, including email correspondence. This requirement begins with the issuance of an IFB and ends upon execution of the final agreement or when the IFB has been cancelled. Violators of this prohibition shall be subject to sanctions as provided in the Manatee County Code of Laws.

#### A.12 UNBALANCED BIDDING PROHIBITED

County recognizes that large and/or complex projects will often result in a variety of methods, sources, and prices. However, where in the opinion of the County such variation does not appear to be justified, given bid requirements and industry and market conditions, the bid will be presumed to be unbalanced. Examples of unbalanced bids will include:

- a. Bids showing omissions, alterations of form, additions not specified, or required conditional or unauthorized alternate bids.
- b. Bids quoting prices that substantially deviate, either higher or lower, from those included in the bids of competitive bidders for the same line item unit costs.
- c. Bids where the unit costs offered are in excess of or below reasonable cost analysis values.

In the event County determines that a bid is presumed unbalanced, it will request the opportunity to and reserves the right to, review all source quotes, bids, price lists, letters of intent, etc., which the bidder obtained and upon which the bidder relied upon to develop its bid. County reserves the right to reject as nonresponsive any presumptive unbalanced bids where the bidder is unable to demonstrate the validity and/or necessity of the unbalanced unit costs.

#### A.13 WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Bidders may withdraw bids as follows:

- a. Mistakes discovered before the public bid opening may be withdrawn by written notice from the bidder submitting the bid. This request must be received in the Purchasing Division prior to the time set for delivery and opening of the bids. A copy of the request shall be retained and the unopened bid returned to the bidder; or
- b. After the bids are opened or a selection has been determined, but before an agreement is signed, a bidder alleging a material mistake of fact may be permitted to withdraw their bid if:
  - 1. The mistake is clearly evident in the solicitation document; or
  - 2. Bidder submits evidence which clearly and convincingly demonstrates that a mistake was made. Request to withdraw a bid must be in writing and approved by the Purchasing Official.

## A.14 IRREVOCABLE OFFER

Any bid may be withdrawn up until the time and date set for opening of the bid. Any bid not so withdrawn shall, upon opening, constitute an <u>irrevocable offer for a period of ninety (90) days</u> to sell to Manatee County the goods or services set forth in the attached IFB until one or more of the bids have been duly accepted by County.

# A.15 BID EXPENSES

All expenses for submitting bids to the County are to be borne by the bidder.

# A.16 RESERVED RIGHTS

County reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all bids, to waive irregularities and technicalities, and to request resubmission. Also, County reserves the right to

accept all or any part of the bid and to increase or decrease quantities to meet additional or reduced requirements of County. Any sole response received by the first submission date may or may not be rejected by County depending on available competition and current needs of County. For all items combined, the bid of the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder will be accepted, unless all bids are rejected.

The <u>lowest</u>, responsible bidder shall mean that bidder who makes the lowest bid to sell goods and/or services of a quality which meets or exceeds the quality of goods and/or services set forth in the IFB documents or otherwise required by County.

To be <u>responsive</u>, a bidder shall submit a bid which conforms in all material respects to the requirements set forth in the IFB. <u>Bidders must fully comply with the IFB documents in their entirety</u>.

To be a <u>responsible</u> bidder, the bidder shall have the capability in all respects to perform fully the bid requirements, and the tenacity, perseverance, experience, integrity, reliability, capacity, facilities, equipment, and credit which will assure good faith performance.

Also, County reserves the right to make such investigation as it deems necessary to determine the ability of any bidder to furnish the service requested. Information County deems necessary to make this determination shall be provided by the bidder. Such information may include, but shall not be limited to current financial statements, verification of availability of equipment and personnel, and past performance records.

#### A.17 APPLICABLE LAWS

Bidder must be authorized to transact business in the State of Florida. All applicable laws and regulations of the State of Florida and ordinances and regulations of Manatee County will apply to any resulting agreement. Any involvement with the Manatee County Purchasing Division shall be in accordance with the Manatee County Purchasing Ordinance as amended.

# A.18 SCRUTINIZED COMPANIES

Section 287.135, Florida Statutes, prohibits agencies from contracting with companies, for goods or services over \$1,000,000, that are on either the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List. Both lists are created pursuant to section 215.473, Florida Statutes.

At the time a company submits a bid or proposal for a contract or before the company enters into or renews a contract with an agency or governmental entity for goods or services of \$1 million or more, the company must certify that the company is not on the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or the Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List.

# A.19 COLLUSION

By submitting a bid in response to this IFB, bidder certifies that it has not divulged, discussed or compared its bid with any other bidder, and has not colluded with any other bidder or parties to this bid whatsoever. Also, bidder certifies, and in the case of a joint bid each party thereto certifies as to their own organization, that in connection with this bid:

- a. any prices and/or cost data submitted have been arrived at independently, without consultation, communication, or agreement, for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices and/or cost data, with any other bidder or with any competitor;
- any prices and/or cost data quoted for this bid have not been knowingly disclosed by the bidder and will not knowingly be disclosed by the bidder, prior to the scheduled opening, directly or indirectly to any other bidder or to any competitor;
- no attempt has been made or will be made by the bidder to induce any other person or firm to submit or not to submit a bid for the purpose of restricting competition;
- d. the only person or persons interested in this bid, principal or principals is/are named therein and that no person other than therein mentioned has any interest in this bid or in the resulting agreement to be entered into; and
- e. no person or agency has been employed or retained to solicit or secure the resulting agreement upon an agreement or understanding or a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee except bona fide employees or established commercial agencies maintained by bidder for purpose of doing business.

# A.20 CODE OF ETHICS

With respect to this bid, if any bidder violates, directly or indirectly, the ethics provisions of the Manatee County Procurement Code and/or Florida criminal or civil laws related to public procurement, including but not limited to Florida Statutes Chapter 112, Part III, Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, such bidder will be disqualified from eligibility to perform services or provide the goods described in this IFB, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids to supply goods or services to Manatee County.

By submitting a bid, the bidder represents to County that all statements made and materials submitted are truthful, with no relevant facts withheld. If a bidder is determined to have been untruthful in their bid or any related presentation, such bidder will be disqualified from eligibility to provide the goods and/or services described in this IFB, and may also be disqualified from furnishing future goods or services to, and from submitting any future bids to supply goods or services to Manatee County.

### A.21 PUBLIC CONTRACTING AND ENVIRONMENTAL CRIMES

A person or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime, as that term is defined in Section 287.133, Florida Statutes, may not submit a bid to provide any goods or services to a public entity; may not submit a bid with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work; may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity; may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under an agreement with any public entity; and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Section 287.017, Florida Statutes, for Category Two for a period of thirty-six (36) months following the date of being placed on the convicted list.

In addition, the Manatee County Procurement Code prohibits the award of any bid to any person or entity who/which has, within the past five (5) years, been convicted of, or admitted to in court or sworn to under oath, a public entity crime or of any environmental law that, in the reasonable opinion of the Purchasing Official, establishes reasonable grounds to believe the person or business entity will not conduct business in a responsible matter.

To ensure compliance with the foregoing, the Code requires all persons or entities desiring to do business with County to execute and file with the Purchasing Official an affidavit, executed under the pain and penalties of perjury, confirming that person, entity and any person(s) affiliated with the entity, does not have such a record and is therefore eligible to seek and be awarded business with County. In the case of a business entity other than a partnership or a corporation, such affidavit shall be executed by an authorized agent of the entity. In the case of a partnership, such affidavit shall be executed by the general partner(s). A Public Contracting and Environmental Crimes Certification form is attached herein for this purpose.

# A.22 CONTRACT

The agreement resulting from the acceptance of a bid shall be in the form of purchase order.

#### A.23 TERMINATION OF CONTRACT

Manatee County reserves the right to terminate any contract, at any time, with or without cause.

#### A.24 PURCHASING COOPERATIVE

It is the intent of this Invitation for Bid to include requirements and to obtain bids on behalf of Manatee County and reserve the right for the entities belonging to the Sarasota Bay Chapter of NIGP to obtain purchases from this bid proposal. This opportunity is also made available to any and all local, County, Public Educational Institutions, non-profits, and the State of Florida. Pursuant to their own governing laws, and subject to the agreement of the vendor, other entities may be permitted to make purchases at the

terms and conditions contained herein. Manatee County will not be financially responsible for the purchase of other entities from this solicitation.

#### A.25 DISCOUNTS

Any and all discounts must be incorporated in the prices contained in the bid and not shown separately. The prices indicated on the Bid Form shall be the prices used in determining award.

#### A.26 TAXES

Manatee County is exempt from Federal Excise and State Sales Taxes. (F.E.T. Cert. No. 59-78-0089K; Florida Sales Tax Exempt Cert. No. 85-8012622206C-6); therefore, the bidder is prohibited from delineating a separate line item in his bid for any sales or service taxes. Nothing herein shall affect the bidder's normal tax liability.

The successful bidder shall be responsible for the payment of taxes of any kind and character, including, but not limited to sales, consumer, use, and other similar taxes payable on account of the work performed and materials furnished under the award in accordance with the laws and regulations of the place of the project which are applicable during the performance of the work. Nothing herein shall affect the bidder's normal tax liability.

#### A.27 DESCRIPTIVE INFORMATION

Unless otherwise specifically provided in the IFB documents, all equipment, materials and articles provided shall be new and of the most suitable grade for the purpose intended. Unless otherwise specifically provided in the IFB documents, reference to any equipment, material, article or patented process, by trade name, brand name, make or catalog number, shall be regarded as establishing a standard of quality and shall not be construed as limiting competition.

#### A.28 DELIVERY

Unless otherwise specified, all prices are to be FOB Destination.

#### A.29 AUTHORIZED PRODUCT REPRESENTATION

The bidder, by virtue of submitting the name and specifications of a manufacturer's product, will be required to furnish the named manufacturer's product. Failure to do so may, in the County's sole discretion, be deemed a material breach of the resulting agreement and shall constitute grounds for County's immediate termination of the resulting agreement.

#### A.30 ROYALTIES AND PATENTS

The successful bidder shall pay all royalties and license fees for equipment or processes in conjunction with the equipment and/or services being furnished. Successful bidder shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent, trademark or copyright, and shall save County harmless from loss on account thereof, including costs and attorney's fees.

#### A.31 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

County does not discriminate upon the basis of any individual's disability status. This non-discrimination policy involves every aspect of County's functions including one's access to, participation, employment, or treatment in its programs or activities. Anyone requiring **reasonable accommodation** for an Information Conference or Bid Opening should contact the person named on the cover page of this IFB document at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of either activity.

#### A.32 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

In accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title 15, Part 8 of the Code of Federal Regulations and the Civil Rights Act of 1992, County hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure minority business enterprises are afforded full opportunity to participate in response to this IFB and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, handicap, or marital status in consideration of bid award.

#### A.33 MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE / DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

The State of Florida Office of Supplier Diversity provides the certification process and the database for identifying certified MBE/DBE firms. #### **A.34 SUBCONTRACTORS**

The successful bidder will obtain prior written approval from the County for any subcontractor(s) and the work they will perform. A subcontractor is defined as any entity performing work within the scope of the project who is not an employee of the successful bidder.

Bidders subcontracting any portion of the work shall include a list of subcontractors along with their bid. The list shall include: name and address of subcontractor, type of work to be performed and the percent of the contract amount to be subcontracted.

Prior to the employment of any person under this contract, the successful bidder shall utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of (a) all persons employed during the contract term by the successful bidder to perform employment duties within Florida and (b) all persons, including subcontractors, assigned by the successful bidder to perform work pursuant to the contract with Manatee County. For more information on this process, please refer to United States Citizenship and Immigration Service site at: http://www.uscis.gov/.

Only those individuals determined eligible to work within the United States shall be employed under this contract.

By submission of a bid in response to this IFB, the successful bidder commits that all employees and subcontractors will undergo e-verification before placement on this contract.

If County has reasonable objection to any subcontractor, the County may request the successful bidder to submit an acceptable substitute without an increase in contract sum or contract time.

If successful bidder declines to make any such substitution, the County may award the resulting agreement to the next lowest qualified bidder that proposes to use acceptable subcontractors, who County does not make written objection to. In the event the successful bidder declines to make any such substitution post award, the County may exercise its right to terminate the agreement.

The successful bidder shall maintain sole responsibility for the actions of its employees and subcontractors. New employees brought in after contract award shall follow the same requirement stated above for the life of the contract.

#### A.35 DISCLOSURE

Upon receipt, all inquiries and responses to inquiries related to this IFB become "Public Records", and shall be subject to public disclosure consistent with Florida Statues, Chapter 119.

Bids become subject to disclosure thirty (30) days after the opening or if a notice of intent to award decision is made earlier than this time as provided by Florida Statutes § 119.071(1)(b). No announcement or review of the bid shall be conducted at the public bid opening.

Based on the above, Owner will receive bids at the time and date stated and will make public at the opening the names of the business entities of all that submitted a bid and any amount presented as a total offer without any verification of the mathematics or the completeness of the bid.

### SECTION B SPECIFIC TERMS & CONDITIONS

#### **B.01 PURPOSE**

It is the intent of Manatee County to establish a contract for pump repair and machine work for the Manatee County Utilities Department. It is the specific purpose of this bid to establish an annual contract for required materials and services and to secure the cost and availability of the services for procurement.

#### **B.02 BLANKET ORDER**

Blanket Purchase Order(s) shall be issued as a result of this bid. A Blanket Purchase Order number, when accompanied by a valid Release Order number provided by an authorized County department, will authorize purchases on an "as required" basis. (Note: The quantities shown on the Bid Form are estimates only. There is no guarantee these quantities will be released).

A master agreement with subsequent individual orders shall be used, therefore for payment; each invoice shall indicate the Blanket Purchase Order number followed by a valid Release Order number. The Vendor is not authorized to proceed with, and will not be compensated for, any work that is not authorized by a valid Release Order Number issued by a County representative.

### **B.03** TURNAROUND & DELIVERY TIMES

The primary goal of this contract is the speedy acquisition of repair services; therefore, vendor's responsiveness under the terms of this contract is paramount. The vendor shall pick up equipment requiring repair within 48 hours after being notified by an authorized County representative. Turnaround time between tear downs and inspections and the time repair estimates are received shall be as discussed with and accepted by the authorized representative from the using department. Delivery time for repairs of all pumps after receipt of repair estimates shall also be as discussed with and accepted by the authorized representative from the using department. If delivery time exceeds the time agreed to, then the County reserves the right to assess liquidated damages in an amount not to exceed 10% of the total repair cost of the pump per day until such a time Manatee County deems the pump is repaired.

Note: Any emergency repairs required which are a result of an unexpected and urgent request where health and safety of the public is at risk shall be completed and returned to the pickup location by the successful vendor within forty-eight (48) hours after notification by the County and returned to the pickup location. Failure to communicate with the respective plant location and to respond within the time specified for emergency repairs may result in the work being performed by others and / or termination of this contract.

#### **B.04 PAYMENT**

Within forty-five (45) days after completion of services by the Vendor, acceptance by the County, and presentation of an appropriate invoice, the County shall pay the total amount due. Invoices shall include the Purchase Order number and a valid Release Order number. Receipts showing the vendor's cost for materials must accompany invoices where billing for materials is allowed.

#### **B.05** PRICES

The labor rates on the Bid Form shall include, but not be limited to, all labor involved in the pickup/delivery, diagnostic checkout, all materials including tools, shop equipment and supplies,

on-site, at the vendor's location(s), and return of materials to the point of delivery for both normal and emergency hour repairs. Regular and emergency hours are defined on the Bid Form.

Vendor shall provide invoices as proof of their cost of materials used for each order. If the materials used in the order come out of vendor stock, proof of cost shall be provided and may come from the last order for stock replenishment. Transportation costs including fuel, freight, and handling shall not be included in the materials markup.

#### **B.06 CONTRACT TERM**

This contract shall be for a period of one year, commencing from the date of award, unless renewed or terminated as provided in this bid document.

#### **B.07 RENEWAL**

If not cancelled by the Vendor or the County, this contract shall be automatically extended/renewed beyond the first twelve (12) month contract period for two additional twelve (12) month periods not to exceed a total contract duration of thirty-six (36) months providing there are no changes of prices, terms or conditions. Written notice of intention not to renew must be submitted by the successful bidder 90 days prior to the end of a contract period. Should any Vendor choose not to renew the bid awarded, the County reserves the right to terminate the Contract with that Vendor and select the next qualified bidder, or re-advertise for those items, or solicit a new Invitation for Bid for all items (including multiple bid awards).

#### **B.08 CANCELLATION**

It is mutually agreed that any award made as a result of this bid may be cancelled by the Vendor upon 90 days written notice sent by Certified Mail to the County. However, the County is hereby authorized to purchase, in accordance with the prices quoted, any quantity of labor during this 90 day interim provided the County requests delivery during this period.

The County reserves the right to terminate a contract (or item award) by giving 30 days written notice of intention to terminate if at any time the Vendor fails to abide by or fulfill any of the terms and conditions of the contract. The County also reserves the right to terminate the contract for any of the items herein for the convenience of the County, with or without cause.

# **B.09** WARRANTY, MAINTENANCE, SERVICE AND SUPPORT

All work, materials, and equipment furnished shall be guaranteed and warranted by the Vendor for a minimum period of <u>one (1) year</u>, unless otherwise specified, from final acceptance by the County to be free from defects due either to faulty materials or equipment or faulty workmanship. All materials, equipment, and workmanship furnished and installed by the Vendor is warranted and guaranteed by the Vendor to meet the required standards and to accomplish the purposes and functions of the project as defined, detailed, and specified herein.

The County shall, following discovery thereof, promptly give written notice to the Vendor of faulty materials, equipment, or workmanship within the period of the guarantee and the Vendor shall promptly replace any part of the faulty equipment, material, or workmanship at his own cost. These warranty and guarantee provisions create no limitations on the County as to any claims or actions for breach of guaranty or breach of warranty that the County might have against parties other than the Vendor, and do not constitute exclusive remedies of the County against the Vendor.

#### **B.10 SUBCONTRACTORS**

It is expected that the Vendor shall have in-house capability to provide all the services required by this contract; however, should the Vendor find it necessary to utilize the services of a subcontractor, the Vendor shall first obtain the approval of the County. The Vendor shall also require each subcontractor to adhere to applicable provisions of this contract, including obtaining the Certificate of Liability Insurance from the subcontractor(s). The utilization of any subcontractor shall not relieve the Vendor from any liability or responsibility to the County pursuant to the provisions of this contract or obligate the County to the payment of any compensation to the subcontractor or additional compensation to the Vendor.

#### **B.11 BIDDERS QUALIFICATIONS**

- a. Vendor shall have been registered with the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations for at least two (2) continuous years.
- b. Vendor shall have all engineering, design, and metalizing, welding, heat-treating, machining, balancing, calibrating and testing capabilities necessary to completely refurbish any pumps listed on the Bid Form.
- c. Service capabilities will include but not be limited to: Shop cranes; despoiling device(s); winding system.
- d. Equipment used for inspecting, calibrating and testing pumps and motors shall be up-todate and have calibration certificates traceable to the National Institute of Standards (NIST) where applicable.
  - Vendor shall make available, upon request by County, data confirming the equipment used for inspecting, calibrating and testing pumps are up-to-date along with calibration certifications which are traceable to NIST standards where applicable.
- e. Calibration equipment shall include, at a minimum: gage blocks, micrometers, dial indicators, colt meters, amp meters, test panels and vibration analyzers.

All responsible individuals shall be available by telephone, cellular telephone, and/or pager at all times. Vendor shall provide experienced, capable personnel to direct and complete work in a manner satisfactory to the County as well as in accordance with industry standards and Federal, State and Local Laws, regulations and guidelines.

# SECTION C MINIMUM TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

#### C.01 SCOPE OF SERVICES

The bidder shall provide annual certified repair service for pumps, pump parts, and technical services for pump equipment on an "AS REQUIRED" basis in accordance with the specifications described herein.

The bidder's service center shall be a qualified pump repair facility. The service center shall be within a one hundred (100) mile radius of the County's location. The service center shall demonstrate that it has done business as a pump repair center for not less than two (2) continuous years and is engaged in repairing horizontal and vertical pump units, and various other pumps listed herein. Shop equipment of vendor shall be of a size and type required to accommodate the sizes and types of pumps listed in these specifications.

The successful Vendor shall provide all transportation, labor, materials, tests and equipment pick up for the Pump Repair and Machine Work and perform any reconditioning necessary to return the equipment to the point of delivery, fully operational. All material replacements must Tear down and inspection is mandatory unless both parties agree it is not necessary (e.g. an obvious external problem). If the pump is disassembled, seal replacement is mandatory. Original equipment manufacturing (OEM) shall be adhered to for all pump replacement parts and machine work, including balancing.

#### C.02 INTENT

The intent of this repair specification is to achieve a consistent, high quality diagnosis, repair and/or overhaul of a pump and / or motor and return it to good operating condition with a minimum of delay and cost. Not all repair situations can be covered in this repair specification. In the absence of specific instructions, the requirement shall be to restore the pump to its manufactured condition.

#### C.04 EQUIPMENT REPAIR

The types of equipment that may be repaired as a result of this Invitation for Bid may include but are not limited to:

- Submersible pumps
- Emulsifier screens
- Various types of valves
- Hydraulic systems

#### C.05 MACHINE WORK DEFINED

Machine work, as defined herein, shall apply to the drilling and tapping of broken bolts, the repairing of damaged locking rings and stators, the replacing of power cords, power cord assemblies and power cord connectors and repairs to impellers, covers, volutes, mounting rails, bearing journals, and pump shafts.

#### C.06 REPAIR ESTIMATES AND INVOICES

1. County Repair Form: The equipment will be accompanied by a repair form from the County requesting service that will list the perceived problems, the operating environment, and urgency of the repair, past problems where applicable, the requested repair service, any missing parts and the representative within the County Department to be contacted about the repair. A diagnosis and probable cause of the equipment failure or conditions that contributed to the equipment failure shall be included.

During repair, actions and findings shall be recorded by the Vendor on a Repairer's Tracking Form. A Repairer's Tracking Form is the successful bidder's work order or service sheet that shall contain records of all work done, problems noted, checks and measurements taken during the work, repairs carried out and final tests conducted prior to shipping. The successful vendor(s) shall return the repaired pump with this Repairer's Tracking Form and will be responsible for maintaining a copy of the form on file for a minimum period of three years.

- 2. Check shaft straightness- Measure the bearing bores, shells, housings and shaft journals using a micronometer. Outside diameter of bore of housing shall have 0.000" to -0.001" loose fit. Repairs are necessary when tolerance exceeds 0.0015". Machine work shall be approved by the authorized County representative before being performed or machine work will not be paid. Bearings journals, seal surfaces and bearing housing restoration shall be done by metalizing and machining or boring and busing. Documentation of before and after measurements shall be made by the Vendor on the Repairer's Tracking Form.
- 3. Install new bearings per manufacturer's specifications. All grease fittings, plugs, etc. shall be replaced unless otherwise indicated by the Authorized County representative. Bearings shall be properly lubricated and bearing oil reservoirs shall be filled where practical. All equipment shall be tagged with information as to whether or not bearing oil reservoirs were filled and what type of lubricant was used. All removed bearings shall be returned to the County.
- 4. The Vendor shall replace all gaskets on all associated equipment repairs.
- 5. A copy of all tests indicating satisfactory results shall be submitted to the County with the repaired pump.

After inspection of the equipment picked up for repair, <u>BUT</u> before any repairs have commenced, the successful vendor shall provide the County authorized representative with a written, numbered cost estimate for all pieces of equipment designated for repair which include but is not limited to: a detailed description of the work to be done; the make, model and serial/asset number of the equipment involved; an approximation of man-hours required and parts/materials costs; and approximate time required for completion of repairs. Estimated man-hours shall not

exceed Vaughen's recommended practices. Tear down and inspection is mandatory unless both Vendor and County agree it is not necessary (e.g. an obvious external problem). Seal replacement is mandatory if the equipment is disassembled.

The repair estimate shall include the following:

- a. Job Number / Estimate Number.
- b. Itemized description of the repair including whether or not the equipment needs an entire overhaul or just bearing replacement and cleanup (substantiate findings).
- c. Any new parts needed and costs itemized.
- d. Time needed to complete repair along with justification if longer than the time allocated by the Vaughen's Motor and Pump Repair Price Guide.
- e. Cost for repair (repair needs and labor hours shall be itemized).
- f. Options and recommendations for repair or replacement if applicable.

Repair of the equipment shall not commence until County's authorized representative has approved the estimate. A Release Order cannot be issued until the exact work is specified and approved. Invoices shall reflect the Job or Estimate Number, Release Order Number, the Blanket Purchase Order Number, description of the work, itemized parts and labor costs in accordance with the Bid pricing, and the date the equipment repairs were accepted by the County. Failure to include the information stated shall result in rejection of the invoice. NOTE: Billable hours shall include shop hours or on-site hours only. All trip charges, travel time, mileage and other expenses shall be included in the per-hour rate.
