EVALUATION RESULTS:

The Evaluation Committee (the "Committee") convened in August 2017 to review evaluation committee responsibilities, discuss member's availability for future meetings, and the Florida Sunshine Law as applicable to public meetings. The Evaluation Committee then proceeded to review each of the seven (7) proposals for their responsiveness to the requirements of the RFP. As a result of the discussion, the Committee unanimously voted to invite three (3) firms to Oral Presentations. The Evaluation Committee (the "Committee") reconvened in September 2017 to evaluate the aforementioned Oral Presentations.

Arthur J. Gallagher & Company, Tampa, FL – Arthur J. Gallagher & Company presented exceptional qualifications in their written proposal and oral presentation. With an office in Tampa and ten (10) offices across the state of Florida, the firm's key personnel demonstrated a unique understanding of the County's health plan through their own independent research and presented a more holistic project approach to employee health and benefit consulting. The Evaluation Committee also noted that the key personnel for Arthur J. Gallagher & Company were readily accessible and willing to work with the County in order to further goals and objectives of Employee Health and Benefits. After further deliberation, it was determined by the Evaluation Committee that Arthur J. Gallagher & Company be recommended for the Intent to Negotiate award.

Towers Watson Delaware, Inc., Tampa, FL – Towers Watson Delaware, Inc., also known as Willis Towers Watson, presented very strong qualifications in their written proposal and oral presentation. Willis Towers Watson provided a solid understanding of the County's health plan and presented innovative solutions to the health and benefit issues faced by the County. Upon further investigation however, the Evaluation Committee determined that Willis Towers Watson's project management / approach was not as robust and the proposed price was not as competitive compared to the recommended firm. As a result, the Evaluation Committee determined that the firm should be ranked second.

Lockton Companies, Naples, FL – Lockton Companies presented acceptable qualifications in their written proposal and oral presentation. Although very familiar with the County's health plan structure, Lockton Companies' project team relied heavily on their past experience with Collier County and did not provide a complete overview of Lockton Companies as a whole. Although it seemed like Lockton Companies team was very unified, the Evaluation Committee determined that the project approach was relatively limited compared to the direction set forth in the RFP. As a result, the Evaluation Committee determined that Lockton Companies be ranked third.

Upon completion of the Oral Presentations on September 28, 2017, the Committee reconvened on October 3, 2017 in order to continue deliberation and ultimately recommend the Intent to Negotiate award for **Arthur J. Gallagher & Company**, Tampa, FL, to the County Administrator.

The Evaluation Committee voted 3 to 0 to proceed with the award to Arthur J. Gallagher & Company, Tampa, FL.
